

Speldhurst Allotments Holders and Gardeners Facebook Page

A Facebook page has been set up for the Allotments and for like-minded people interested in gardening. If you an allotment holder or keen gardener (or even a budding gardener) and also on Facebook, please join. The purpose is to offer a source of news, views, sharing and caring about our allotments and gardening activities.

Here is a useful tip I saw the other day: make a shallow trench for your seeds by laying a broom handle and treading on it to press it down firmly.

I've never tried this. But it sounds like a great idea. I often struggle with my seed trenches – they tend to be too wide, too deep, not straight, etc. At least you will know that the trench is straight, compact and to a controlled depth.

Here is another great idea as we approach Spring. Be gentle on newly planted seeds. Use an ordinary sieve or pasta strainer to lightly dust with soil when first sowing as a layer too thick can prevent them from germinating properly.

I definitely need to use this technique.

The Joys of a Wildlife Pond – by Brian Shilling

During lockdown last year many people discovered the wonders of gardening for the first time as well as everyone having more time to enjoy their gardens and the wildlife they attract.

One way to add to this pleasure, while also increasing the variety of beneficial wildlife visiting your garden, is by installing a wildlife pond.

Over the last century almost 70% of ponds have disappeared from the UK countryside. Garden ponds therefore play an increasingly important role for wildlife, offering vital habitat, food and drink. Ponds attract a wide variety of life – amphibians, butterflies (and other insects) birds, plants and maybe even hedgehogs.

These inhabitants and visitors in turn can benefit gardeners by pollinating plants and helping to keep slug and aphid populations down. They are also a constant source of interest for adults and children alike (but if children have access, don't forget to fence off or place a rigid wire grid over the pond).

The larger the pond the more wildlife you can expect to attract but even if you only have space for a bucket sunk into the ground you will be providing a valuable habitat and water source for local wildlife.

Wildlife can find a new pond surprisingly quickly. Pond skaters and diving beetles, for example, can appear within a few weeks and amphibians can often appear within the first year. Nature can also bring plants into your pond but many gardeners prefer to speed up the process by bringing plants in from an aquatic plant centre.

These specialists can offer advice about the different kinds of plant ideal for your pond. However, you would ideally aim to get:

- 1. Underwater oxygenating plants to provide cover for tadpoles and other larvae.
- 2. Plants that poke out of the water for emerging larvae such as

- dragonfly.
- 3. Floating plants for insects to rest on when landing for a drink.
- 4. Pollinator friendly marginal plants to attract bees and hover flies in summer.

There is loads of good advice online about building and maintaining a wildlife pond - for example from Froglife, RHS, Wildlife Trust and RSPB.

Nature Watch

Due to lockdown I have been birding around the village instead of the North Kent marshes. I have seen Redwings eating Ivy berries, Grey Herons along mill stream, Buzzards seen or heard all around the village but best of all was a female Stonechat just east of the sewage works in the area of the rough grassland on fence posts and bramble. This bird is wintering with us; they are found on Ashdown Forest locally but are widespread on the moors in summer where they nest in gorse and other dense shrubs. It is one bird that is doing well and on the increase.

On the feeders in the garden up to 20 Siskins were seen feeding on Sunflower hearts. These are another winter visitor and they breed in Conifer forests. Plus all the locals such as four species of the Tit family, Nuthatch, Great Spotted Woodpecker etc. Even at this time of year there are still fungi to find. A lovely group of Turkey Tail on a log in the wood, and on elder this time of the year a plain brown ear shaped fungi called Jelly Ear can be found, and on dead oak twigs a bright yellow Brain fungus stands out.



This month should be out

primroses with lesser

celandine and even a few violets if the weather has been warm. The first butterflies such as Comma, Peacock will be out and the Brimstone which is yellow in colour and really stands out when flying. Birds will be nesting and by the end of the month summer migrants such as Swallows and Chiffchaffs will be coming back.

VACANCY FOR THE CLERK TO THE PARISH COUNCIL AND RFO Speldhurst Parish Council is seeking to fill the part-time role of Clerk and Responsible Singuish Officer (RFO). The position is based in the office of

Responsible Financial Officer (RFO). The position is based in the office at Langton Green Recreation Ground.

The ideal candidate will have experience of local government and a qualification such as CILCA, although it will consider applicants who do not have the qualification on the understanding that they commit to achieving it within a two-year period. Applicants must be computer literate and a working knowledge of Microsoft 365 would be an advantage. The successful candidate should also be experienced in managing staff, a good communicator, have proven organisational and administrative skills and be able to take accurate minutes at meetings which mostly occur in the evening.

The council will consider splitting the role of clerk and RFO and the hours will reflect that. The position will require a minimum of 22 hours pw to a maximum of 30 hours pw – the maximum will incorporate both roles. Initial salary will be within the scale point range 25-30 (£29,577 and £33,782 for a 37-hour week pro rata) depending on the role, qualification, and experience.

A comprehensive handover will be provided prior to the retirement of the current clerk.

PRECEPT 2021

In view of the current situation with covid-19, the impact on families, and in many cases incomes, the council felt it inappropriate to increase the precept this year. However, one of the consequences of this pandemic is that more households or families are experiencing hardship and are being granted exemption or discount from paying council tax (of which the precept forms part). The number of properties in our parish on which the precept is levied has therefore reduced, as is the case in many other parishes this year. This means that the same level of precept for Speldhurst Parish is shared between fewer households so it will still look like a slight increase for those households which do pay.

Despite the council's static income (or lower income in inflation-adjusted terms), we will seek to deliver the same level of service for parish residents and will be working hard on your behalf.

Here, one of our children has painted in the style of the French artist, Sonia Delaunay. In science, we've been studying sound and making musical instruments. The class have made a range of instruments, from elastic band guitars to lollipop stick harmonicas, all of which work fantastically.

The children of Crispin Class (Year 5) have not only been working hard during lockdown to keep up with the demanding Y5 curriculum, but have thoroughly enjoyed catching up with each other on Zoom calls since the New Year. If we can't all be together for now, a screen will simply have to do!

As well as investigating all things Indian for this term's topic – including chatting on Zoom to ex-Speldhurst teaching assistant and New Delhi resident, Nikki Walker – we've been busy creating stunning, mixed-media Himalayan landscapes with authentic flora and fauna.

The first lesson of a particularly wintry week was especially popular: investigate the fun properties of snow! As you can see, despite the rather thin layer of the white stuff, there was no stopping this lot.

Russet class (Year 6) have been busy busy busy this term completing lots of art projects related to our book *Floodland* by Marcus Sedgwick. The children in school worked together to create a sponged seascape display. Every child at school and at home has made a mountain out of recycled materials or ingredients to make a cake mountain.

We have studied the work of David Hockney and produced our own Hockney landscapes. This week, we have experimented with making our own paper - it was a little messy but great fun!

Speldhurst Cookbook

Another lovely recipe from Penny Gerrard - perfect as an activity for the school Easter holidays at the end of the month.

Easy Shortbread

285g butter 285g plain flour 140g cornflour 140g sugar Optional 40g almonds Caster sugar to dredge

Preheat the oven to 150 °C. Line a 7x11 inch tin and grease. Put all ingredients into a food processor and blitz until breadcrumb consistency.

Empty the crumb mix into the tin and press down gently with the back of a spoon. Flatten the edges.

Bake for one hour or until golden brown.

Dredge with caster sugar and cut into fingers whilst still warm. Eat straight away or store in an air-tight tin.

A Letter from St Mary's

March 2021

Dear Friends,

This time last year, on Sunday 15th March 2020 to be precise, we held our last pre-lockdown services in our church buildings. You don't need me to tell you that so much has happened since then, including a lot of learning. Here (with thanks to the work of Carey Nieuwhof) are some of the things that I have learnt.

Lockdown came swiftly; opening up will be much slower and patchy. There will be no "Grand Opening Up Day" for churches, shops, pubs, gyms or any public space. Restrictions will be eased gradually and at different paces for different places. Even when they have been largely lifted, many people will still be cautious about going out.

The one certainty is uncertainty. The latest lockdown looked as if it was working well and then the so-called Kent variant appeared out of the blue. Next, the South African variant arrived unannounced and who knows what other twists and turns are ahead for the world. Much as we might long for certainty, the healthy option is to take each day as it comes.

We can learn from the Stockdale Paradox. Admiral James Stockdale was a US Navy POW in Vietnam. He was tortured but survived. Back in the USA he reflected that in his camp it was the optimists who died first; they were always expecting to be liberated soon and constantly disappointed. Stockdale believed that he would be rescued but not in the short term. That hope kept him going and enabled him to face the suffering. Hope in difficult times – belief in the future while living in the present – will keep us going, grounded and Christ like.
