

Autumn Sundays in October at Hole Park Gardens



Hole Park Gardens in Kent are renowned for their beauty all year round including spectacular autumn colour when the gardens extend their opening to include Autumn Sundays in October in addition to Wednesdays and Thursdays. The stunning exotic border is full of vibrant colours in October including cannas and dahlias. The late flowering agapanthus 'Hole Park Blue' can also be seen in the formal gardens.

The magnificent mature trees and Japanese Maples provide striking autumn colour at this time of year around the 16 acre gardens and 10 acre woodland. Visitors can enjoy a circular walk which takes walkers past a delightful carved wooden sculpture of a family of bears climbing a tree to reach a honey pot and also a renovated 'Ice House' which was built in around 1740 to store ice long before the days of refrigeration. When the ice was cut and stacked it would last for up to three years in this cool environment!

Open on Wednesday and Thursdays until the end of October visitors can also enjoy additional Sunday opening on 3rd, 10th, 17th & 24th and 31st October 2021. 11am to dusk. Lunches, afternoon tea with homemade cakes will be available in the coach house tearoom.



Unwanted Garden Visitors

We have all had to deal with the attentions of unwanted visitors to our gardens and allotments. Being so close to the countryside it would be surprising if we hadn't. Deer, rabbits, mice, rats, foxes and even sheep. All can be unwelcome. But I find that badgers are the most destructive of all. On the allotments they take corn on the cob, broad beans, carrots and will attack potato beds too. They seem to sense the perfect moment when they are ready to be picked. At home, they dig up my lawn.

We all love badgers. Of course we do. They are great wildlife. I even have a set in my garden. But how do we live with them without causing harm or finding our crops decimated or lawns destroyed? What do my gardening books say? I started in my Garden Problem Solver book. No mention of badgers!! Deer - yes. Rabbits - yes. Badgers - no!! 4 other books. Nothing. Then the 5th - BINGO - badgers in the index. Here is the extracted section.

'We often forget that many unwanted visitors to our gardens have a much keener sense of smell than we do. This means the smallest amount of deterrent can be effective. Squirrels, badgers and rabbits can be dissuaded by sprinkling chilli powder.' The book also mentions lion dung. Anybody got any? Apparently, you can buy it on Amazon.

An internet search threw up a few more options.

Scotch Bonnet Chilli Peppers – scatter crushed scotch bonnet chilli peppers around the garden, especially near entrances. Badgers will sense the substance is irritating to their noses and will turn away.

Citronella Oil - applying it to the bottom of fences and around entrances may be enough to keep them away.

Motion Sensor Floodlights – investing in good security lights that are triggered by motion will help to repel badgers as well as being good for your overall home security. An allotment holder also has a sound system that emits a buzzing noise. This does actually seem to have worked.

HOW TO REPORT A HIGHWAYS FAULT

How do I report this? When is someone going to fix it? What can be done?

These are some of the most common questions you ask us about highways faults in Speldhurst Parish. Often, the answer can be found at

This is an online reporting tool which covers almost every type of carriageway and pavement fault you can think of, from traffic cones left behind by contractors, to potholes and overgrown pavements.

KCC also advise that it is easier for them to schedule repairs works efficiently when issues are reported in this way. So, while you might think that getting hold of a name or telephone number will get your complaint dealt with more quickly, the feedback we receive from residents using the online tool is that it really is the speediest way to get things done. If you do not have access to the internet and no one to do it for you, our clerks will help.

To ensure a smooth and happy transition back into school this term, there is an even greater emphasis on the importance of older pupils as buddies to their younger peers. Year 6 will support reception and also **(as seen in this group photo below)** Year 1 children. Year 4 will befriend Year 2, and Year 5 will work with Year 3.



Speldhurst has always prided itself on its creative approach to education which stimulates pupils to learn, encouraging their natural curiosity and resourcefulness, whilst meeting academic demands.

The children all look forward with excitement to the ‘stunning start’ of their new termly topics.

For all the older Key Stage 2 pupils, this term started with a virtual flight to the moon which inspired some extraordinarily creative writing, whilst Year 5 Crispin class followed in Einstein’s footsteps with science experiments into the properties of light. They discovered how shadows are formed, how light is made up of many colours – and also **(as this photo shows)** that light does, indeed, travel in straight lines. ‘Brilliant’ said their teacher.







A Letter from St Mary's

October 2021



Dear Friends,

Harvest time is upon us. It's always a lovely celebration of the goodness of creation and the generosity of God's provision but this year I think it has a bit of an edge to it. We've all seen the terrible damage that extreme weather has caused around the globe and nations preparing

for COP26 put the health of our planet in the political spotlight.

The public is generally supportive of tackling this crucial issue and the science is now rarely challenged. The questions are around what to do. Some things have to be done by governments because only they can make big changes. People like you and me can only make much smaller changes but if we all do them, they will add up to something very significant.

I'm finding that it requires some hard choices, especially about diet and travel (i.e. about sausages and flying). You will have your own personal challenges.

Can I suggest that this Harvest time we all take the opportunity to stop and have a think about what we might do. That could be about one or two lifestyle changes, or it could be some sort of campaign for a bigger change. Motivation can come from several sources. At the most selfish level it could be about doing all that we can to ensure that we don't end up in a violent storm or with our garden parched. A more altruistic approach might be a commitment to ensuring the next generation or the poor of this generation don't suffer. A theological perspective is that in caring for creation we are caring for something that is very important to God.
