

We also have to mention James and Bee - otherwise known as the Peasant Farmers. They raise pedigree Saddleback Pigs and Sussex Cattle on their small farm in Langton Green. Living in large fields, the animals spend their days happily rootling and grazing, which adds so much to the flavour!

Speldhurst Chapel Project

It has been some time since the open village meeting on 20th April, organised jointly by St Mary's Church and Speldhurst Community Shop, and our subsequent Facebook update on 2nd May.



We are pleased to be able to report

that since then a working group of 11 Speldhurst residents has been created to progress the project. That group has now met four times. Thank you to all of them for stepping up.

The working group is considering the various work streams necessary to turn the Chapel project into reality, including how the existing chapel building could be re-configured to operate both as a space to maintain and expand the community and faith activities, that the Chapel has hosted for many years, as well as a new home for Speldhurst's Community Shop and Post Office. We are also investigating the likely costs of that work. We are also exploring how to finance the project. We are pleased to be able to report that, after we submitted an "Expression of Interest", the Department for Levelling Up, Housing and Communities has confirmed that a formal application can proceed to the Community Ownership Fund for matched funding of up to £250,000. This indicates that the DLUHC considers that our project is likely to meet the criteria of the fund, although it is not a guarantee that we will be successful in bidding for these funds. The DLUHC advise that the next 2 bidding rounds will occur before March 2023. We will aim to submit a formal application in the first of those 2 bidding rounds once the date has been announced.

We are exploring other external sources of finance and it remains the case that part of the funding package will involve seeking funding from the village. Many of these workstreams are at early stages and it's too soon to provide more specific details at this stage. Rest assured we will when it is possible. In the meantime, St Mary's are kindly acting as leaseholder of the Chapel. That lease expires in September 2023. The working group are working with this date in mind, hoping to be in a position to make an offer to buy the Chapel before the expiry of the lease.

THE QUEEN'S GREEN CANOPY

Following the death of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II, it seems fitting that we were able to participate in the Queen's Green Canopy tree-planting initiative earlier this year as part of the Platinum Jubilee. We planted four trees in Ashurst, Langton Green, Old Groombridge and Speldhurst. We are pleased to report that all four saplings survived the hot summer, thanks to dedicated watering from volunteers.



It was touching to read the tributes to Queen Elizabeth from across the parish during the days after Her passing, and we can't think of a better way for residents to remember our late Monarch than to enjoy watching the trees grow in the years ahead.

Ashurst Village Hall, behind St Martin's Church, Ashurst

CLERK'S QUALIFICATION Congratulations to our clerk Katie Neve who has gained her Certificate in Local Council Administration (CiLCA) a little over a year after joining us. A parish council with a CiLCA qualified clerk benefits in two ways; firstly, the clerk can advise Councillors more effectively when it comes to making important decisions that affect the parish. And secondly, a CiLCA gives a parish council the General Power of Competence, which means they can act with greater flexibility to get things done more quickly for the good of the parish.

COUNCILLOR VACANCIES Cllr Dave Pate stepped down from his role as Councillor in August. We were very fortunate to have Dave as Chair of the parish council from 2021-22, and Chair of the highways committee from 2019, where he worked hard to develop an effective working relationship with Kent County Council Highways. Under Dave's leadership, we successfully lobbied for speed reductions in Old Groombridge and Ashurst, and laid the foundations needed to achieve further traffic calming measures across the rest of the parish. We are all sad to see Dave step down but pleased that he will remain as a member of public on our Environment working group.

We are now co-opting a new Parish Councillor to replace Dave. With Cllr Ed Langridge also stepping down in September we are likely to have a further vacancy to fill if no election is called. Do get in touch to find out what the role of Parish Councillor involves.

Speldhurst CEP School News



As I'm writing this in early September, news of the Queen's death is everywhere. Every channel on the BBC and many other media outlets are devoted to the sad news alongside remembrances of Her life and long reign. For most of us, Queen Elizabeth II is the only monarch we have ever known. Now it is 'Long Live the King' and for our pupils at Speldhurst School, King Charles III will be the monarch in their lives. At Speldhurst, it wasn't so long ago that we joined the Queen's Jubilee celebrations. Now with Her death, our Year 6 children wrote their memories of Her Majesty, which they read out to the whole school. The National Anthem was played and the prayers were said for the late Queen and the Royal Family, whilst in class the children went on to learn more about her 70 year and 214 days reign. History in the making.

In Crispin Class, Year 5 children had already begun learning about one of the British monarchy's most infamous historical figures, Henry VIII as an introduction to this term's topic 'Off With her Head' in which they had researched the fate (sometimes gruesome) of his six wives. I expect most of us remember the rhyme 'Divorced, beheaded, died, divorced, beheaded survived' from our own school days. Over the coming weeks, the children will be further investigating this important period in British history, finding out about Tudor palaces, clothing, everyday life, politics and religion, Holbein's portraiture and Henry's children who reigned very differently to their father.



Meanwhile in Empire Class, Year 4 children also had a fantastic start to the new academic year, creating wall displays based on a book called 'The Scarab's secret. This story of intrigue and trickery is set in ancient Egypt and features a scarab beetle as an unusual main character - a fascinating introduction to this term's new topic. Away from the classroom the children also got the opportunity to try out two new sports – basketball and volleyball – and if the photo below is anything to go by, they are already demonstrating some confident ball skills.



It seems a long time ago that we were enjoying the hottest summer in living memory with its opportunities for outdoor learning, both through Forest Schools and activities such as pond-dipping. Visitor Luke from Prior ponds, introduced Galaxy Gala's Year 2 children to a wide variety of moths and pond creatures as part of their learning about habitats and life cycles.



And finally a hearty congratulations to all the children who entered the Vegetable and Flower Show. It was a commendable whole school effort, reflecting two much-loved poems which are part of the English curriculum. The walls of the village hall were alive with tiger portraits by the older Key Stage 2 pupils including hand-written examples of the William Blake poem 'The Tiger' whilst the younger Key Stage 1 children drew their inspiration from Edward Lear's 'The Owl and the Pussycat'.

So when I asked one Year 4 pupil whether he expected to win, I wasn't surprised when he replied: 'Definitely' as in my mind, all the children are winners.

~ Allotment News *



Parsenepys & Karettes

As we are entering the autumn into winter phase, I was 'tickled' to note reference to those staples of this time of year of their 'ancient' names which would a) have been common parlance at the time and b) would have been used to write about them in books.

Bearing in mind the literacy of older times – it is perhaps interesting to note that gardening books have been published for centuries. Along with bibles and other husbandry-oriented topics, gardening books are amongst the oldest genre. The first known surviving gardening book was written by Theophrastus sometime around 300 B.C. Of the 200+ books this prolific philosopher wrote, two gardening books survived – the 9-volumed *Enquiry into Plants* and 6-volumed *Etiology of Plants*.



So influential were these books that their contents were taken as unchallengeable truths until the 15th century.

One of the earliest gardening books in the UK came out in 1445. It covered the whole business of gardening and listed only 78 plants that were suitable for the gardener to grow. The great majority were herbs to make remedies and to use in the kitchen to help get over the gastric problems caused by half-rotten and / or salted meat. Besides the onion family and worts, the list of plants includes radishes, lettuce, spinach and that's just about it! That's not many. But hold on! Worts? Eh?

The suffix ~wort was given to plants which were long considered beneficial. The opposite of a wort was a weed. Just like today, "weeds" referred to undesirable types of plants (though this isn't always the case). Sometimes, plants were given the suffix ~wort because they looked like a part of human anatomy. Liverwort, lungwort, and bladderwort are such plants. The theory was if a plant looked like a body part, then it must be good for that particular organ. It's easy to see the flaw in that line of thinking, especially when one considers liverwort, lungwort, and bladderwort have toxic properties and don't cure liver, lung, or bladder diseases.

Other plants garnered the ~wort ending as they were considered medicinal plants used for the treatment of specific symptoms. Even in modern times the purpose of feverwort, birthwort, and bruisewort seems self-explanatory.

By the middle of the 17th-century ~wort was beginning to fade from everyday use. According to the RHS, the first dedicated gardening manual to be published in English was *Thomas Hill's Profitable Arte of Gardening* published in 1558. Hill wished to make horticultural knowledge more widely available "for the commoditie of many."

From the eighteenth century, the RHS has plucked *Philip Miller's Gardeners Dictionary (1731)*, which took a scientifically detailed approach to the subject – including plants introduced into Britain from the Americas – and London-based *Thomas Fairchild's The City Gardener (1722)*, the earliest guide to urban gardening.

Books about gardens and gardening range from instructional manuals to narrative works spotlighting our emotional connections with plants and planting. These days, the diversity and variety of books published is astonishing. There are books on almost every esoteric subject — evidenced by such fun (though grizzly) — examples as '50 Ways to Kill a Slug'.

However...back to Theophrastus, plants were divided into trees, shrubs and undershrubs – which appears to be a somewhat valueless classification. The belief is also expressed that plants are made pregnant by their own sap in the wintertime and so produce buds in Spring. By our modern understanding, this is clearly not the last word on gardening. But it was the first.

Nature Watch

It always seems to me that at August Bank holiday a switch is thrown and we start early autumn and this year was a classic. Writing this in early September, the very hot summer seems a memory.

The grass is growing and on a walk I found lovely Fungi called Chicken in the Woods, just one of its common names. Autumn is the time for fungi and, if we get plenty of rain after all this hot weather, we should be in for a bumper crop. If you are into gathering wild food, be very careful as fungi have some very poisonous species; others not as deadly but can give a very bad stomach problem. Unless you have them checked by an expert, it's better to buy them from a supermarket.

Thistles are good for pollinators; some species begin to flower in June and July and can be flowering as late as October in common species like Spear Thistle. They can be particularly well visited by insects in the later parts of summer when many other flowers are scarce. Thistles have composite flower heads: many flowers closely clumped together which give an abundance of pollen and nectar. Butterflies like to feed on them. They also give a home for a number of flies and moths in the stems, roots and leaves where they breed. The seeds are loved by Finches such as Goldfinches, a colourful garden bird which can be found in large numbers in the autumn.

A Letter from St Mary's



October 2022

Dear Friends,

It is said that there are only two certainties in life: taxation and death. I suspect that, at the moment, there is one more: we are all heading for a tough period in our lives.

I guess that the cost-of-living crisis is the most obvious problem ahead, with spiralling inflation, public borrowing and uncertainty about long term food and energy security due to the war in Ukraine. Then there is Brexit that is still being worked out, not only in Northern Ireland: in the near future the French will introduce fresh border controls that will take even longer than this year's checks. They are of course perfectly entitled to do this now that we have placed ourselves in the same category as all other foreign countries. Above and beyond all these is the even bigger existential threat of global warming with the danger that pressure on budgets will reduce investment in green technologies and therefore speed up the problem.

How do we respond? Let me suggest five ways. First, we are honest about the situation – life is going to be tough for some time and pretending otherwise won't reduce any suffering. Second, we look out for each other – people were fantastic during Covid in the way we cared for one another, and that spirit needs to continue. Third, we re-evaluate our priorities – better a holiday on the Isle of Wight with money to spare than one in the Mediterranean with money worries. Fourth, we pray for our government at this time. Finally, we look for hope beyond our own horizons – it is at times such as these God's love for humanity and our planet becomes evident.
