

As our name suggests, Speldhurst's Shop has been set up by the community, for the community. We rely on a group of volunteers who help Jo-Anne keep the shop running. We spoke to two of our brilliant volunteers, Cheryl Fenton and Irene Hammond, about why they enjoy working at our beloved village shop.





Why did you want to volunteer?

CF: I had recently retired from full time work so had more time. I was keen to contribute to keeping the shop going. Having lived in the village for 23 years, I really appreciated having the shop nearby with its amazing range of products. I really wanted to give back and make sure it continued to be available to young and old – and me!

IH: I've always been fascinated by the Post Office since I was a child. It was the perfect opportunity to find out how it works and learn a new skill whilst doing so.

What do you enjoy most about volunteering?

CF: Keeping in touch with neighbours. We recently moved from the centre of the village to the outskirts and have far less day-to-day contact with people in the village. Volunteering in the shop has meant I've maintained that social contact and have got to know a lot of people so much better – including which paper they read!

IH: Working at the Post Office really keeps your mind engaged! I learn something new every time. It's a lovely, relaxed environment to work in and the other volunteers are great fun.



What is the most unusual item you've discovered at the shop?

CF: Some of the cheeses come to mind. We have such a wonderful selection: great for a special occasion or to impress at a dinner party - especially since there is advice on which of our wines will pair nicely with them.

What is the most unusual item you've posted at the Post Office?

IH: During the first lockdown, a customer posted toilet rolls to their brother in London who couldn't find any to buy in his local shops!

Do you have a funniest moment volunteering?

CF: Usually when I press the wrong button on the till and the price of a basic item comes up as in excess of £1,000. Customers always join in with a chuckle when I enquire if they would like to pay that amount and any mistake like that is simply rectified with one click on the till.

Which items do you buy the most of from the shop?

IH: The fresh fruit and vegetables are really good quality. The wines are very good too!

CF: Vegetables, cheeses, ingredients I run out of halfway through cooking and make a dash for the shop for ever thankful that it is there!

News from TWB Cllr Matthew Sankey

It seems to me like every week my colleagues and I unearth something that, to me at least, seems to be totally bonkers. The most recent was the discovery that the surplus revenue, so "profit", from parking fines is handed directly to Kent County Council with very little say of how they should spend it. I can't quite get my head around this, so we manage the parking wardens; the spaces, we process the fines, we chase up the bad debt and if there is any money left, we hand it to someone else to spend as they see fit. I'm not suggesting we use parking fines as a way to increase revenue, but we desperately need to be able to have a say in now to spend this surplus to improve our borough, it is after all taken directly out of our pockets.

More Parking Issues

As reported last month, Cabinet have decided to cancel their original plan to revoke the free parking in Paddock wood and Southborough. There is clearly a lot of emotion around the subject, and I have suggested that we bring forward the borough's parking strategy review from a 2024 start to immediately. I have also suggested that the Town Centre is separated from the rural strategy as there are clearly different needs and issues.

And some more...

With thanks to the Parish Council, we are to have some new yellow lines in the village after residents sent me their suggestions. The junction of Cobham's/Braden Rd and the junction or Ferbies/Langton Rd.

We are really lucky to have a great Parish Council here in Speldhurst, they are well organised and seriously pro-active, making my job so much easier, so my thanks to them for getting this through their Highways Improvement Plan so quickly.

REWILDING UPDATE & PHOTO REQUEST



Many thanks to Alan Ford for photographing Pocket Park in Roopers during the summer months as we rewilded part of the land. Pocket Park sits on ancient grassland, which helped it to rewild successfully with little input from us. We documented all sorts of emerging plant and wildlife during the course of the growing season, which included more than 3 different species of Butterfly, and 15 types of wild flower – including a Common Spotted Orchid.

We will put all we have learned to good use next year, so we can really boost biodiversity at Pocket Park. Plans are now afoot to rewild other areas of council- owned land in the parish, and we would also be happy to talk to residents who are considering rewilding an area of their garden.

Did you take any photos of plant or wildlife this summer? We would love you to share them with us so we can add them to our archive.

Anthony Zerpa-Falcón's career in music was launched when he was a runner-up in the BBC Young Musician of the Year Finals. He subsequently won a scholarship to study at the Guildhall School of Music where he won all the major prizes for keyboard. He then competed in several international piano competitions in Spain and Italy and went on to study at the International Piano Foundation in Como, Italy. After winning several prestigious music competitions, he performed widely in the UK before returning to Madrid where he performed throughout Spain and Portugal. On returning to the UK, alongside his career at the keyboard, Anthony took up the position of Musical Director at the Penshurst Choral Society. His work in education has included three years as Director of Music at the Mead Preparatory School. He teaches piano in Tunbridge Wells and at the Knole Academy in Sevenoaks.

Speldhurst School is known for its community atmosphere and Christian Vision, 'Growing into all God wants us to be". And these aren't just empty words. Every day in the classroom through the lessons, friendships and small acts of kindness and support, these words are lived out.

The school has a buddy scheme where older pupils support younger children in all kinds of ways such as helping at meal times and looking out for them in the playground. Human vs Caterpillar

When it comes to public enemy no.1 the mantle has slithered from el Gastropoda to il Pieris Brassicae aka the caterpillar of the white cabbage butterfly. All butterflies, however beautiful, have a caterpillar stage in their life cycle that involves the ingestion of plant material. And that is the problem!!

Most caterpillars have evolved to eat wild or native plants in the UK such as nettles because there are more of them than our overbred and alien garden plants. That said there is one type of caterpillar that most of us gardeners dread; the cabbage white.

There are two types of cabbage white - there is a large white (Pieris Brassicae) and a small white (Pieris Rapae). To make matters worse there is also a cabbage moth (Mamestra Brassicae). Almost seems that our brassicas don't stand a chance.

The major issue is that when the eggs hatch, the emerging caterpillars have a voracious appetite. And wow, do they eat. They feed and feed until they are ready to pupate.

This year, caterpillars have been bountiful. There have been loads of them. A veritable infestation. All munching away at considerable speed. I can almost hear the grinding of tiny molars nibbling away at my Brussels. And what damage they have done.

I have a book titled: Bugs, Slugs & Other Invaders - 50 ways to beat garden enemies.

Lots of invaders addressed. However, there is only 1 mention of dealing with caterpillars which basically involves:

- a) Somehow managing to persuade a group of children to collect the caterpillars and
- b) Chucking the collected creepies into the compost bin where there is lots of decaying vegetation to keep them occupied.

I'm not sure about this option. Whilst it is a humane way of dealing with the dreaded caterpillars – which however, won't address the overall population as the caterpillars will produce more butterflies next year – the key issues seem to be:

- 1. The sheer number of caterpillars. I haven't counted. But I've been astonished and somewhat overwhelmed by the quantity.
- 2. Finding and enticing children to collect the caterpillars. There seem to be so many other ways of being entertained these days.
- 3. Chucking the collected caterpillars in the compost bin where they would be competing with the slugs we placed there using the same technique for them.

Whilst much is debated about predators for our mollusc mates –dealt with in the September issue, what about our caterpillar creepy chums? What munches on them?

You would have thought it would be an absolute feast for birds. Robins - they ought to be all over them at the moment. Blackbirds are normally dashing around gobbling up whatever moves. But where are they now?

Loads of caterpillars. Not a bird to be seen. It's difficult to comprehend why – when the caterpillars in their black and yellow stripy pyjamas are easy to be seen – we aren't also spotting birds rapidly gobbling up the harvest.

A solution put forward by Charles Dowding is to plant brassicas in the autumn for spring consumption. Then they are growing when the butterflies are not laying eggs and caterpillars are not around.

A good idea and I am planning to do just that but with spring cabbage. I currently have some plants still in cells (and not eaten by slugs) in readiness to plant out in the not too distant future.

But how is it possible to have Brussels for Christmas without growing them through the summer? And how can anyone enjoy Christmas Day lunch without Brussels? (Or swede for that matter - another member of the brassica family particularly welcomed by Mr Caterpillar.)

Amongst other reasons, It's why I wanted an allotment.

Nature Watch

The results of the Big Butterfly Count 2022 are in and the Gatekeeper was the species most seen! This is welcome news as the Gatekeeper experienced its second worst Big Butterfly Count result in summer 2021, and it's the first time since 2017 that this species has had the top spot overall.

It was also good news for the Blues, with increases in Common Blue and Holly Blue, and garden favourite the Comma also made a comeback. However, the general decline continues, with fewer butterflies spotted overall. The largest count I had in the garden was 16 Large White and I counted over 150 caterpillars of the above on my cabbage and sprout plants. The best count for Gatekeepers was 5. Let's hope next summer is a better one for Butterflies and wildlife as a whole.

If you are going to feed birds over the winter, putting out different foods and the way they are presented attracts different birds. Fat balls for Long Tailed Tits, Starlings, Blue and Great Tits. Peanuts in a feeder are loved by Greater Spotted Woodpeckers, and Siskin if you are lucky. Mixed seed on a table will give House sparrows, Dunnock and Chaffinches a chance. Striped and Black Sunflower seeds in a feeder are good for Greenfinches, Nut Hatch, Blue, Great and Coal Tits.

On the ground other birds will pick up the fallen pieces such as Blackbirds and Robins. When we feed the birds we must not forget to keep the feeders clean. Take them apart and wash in hot water with a bit of washing up liquid added. Also the ground under the feeders wants to be cleaned regularly too. This will prevent any disease problems occurring. The question has been asked if we should feed all year round or only in the winter. I feed all year, it is better for House Sparrows, If they can find a good food supply they will have at least 2 nesting attempts.

A Letter from St Mary's



November 2022

Dear Friends,

Recently I attended a consultation run by our Borough Council on the cost of living. Some sobering facts were presented; let me give you a flavour by looking at inflation.

We are used to hearing one figure but that is actually the *average* inflation rate. A few items actually get cheaper (some seasonal food for instance) while other prices rise dramatically. Generally, essentials such as food and fuel have the highest rate of inflation. People experience inflation differently: if a high percentage of your income is spent on the essentials, then you will feel the pinch more than those for whom they play a smaller role. It is estimated that if you are in the poorest section of society you will experience inflation at 17.6% in the year ahead in comparison with the richest for whom it will be 10.9%. This ties in with the experience of Nourish, our town's food bank, where the two largest groups of recipients are the over 65s and low-income families with two wages earners.

What's this got to do with Jesus of Nazareth? Well, quite a lot. At the beginning of his public ministry, he read out what we would call a manifesto: 'The Spirit of the Lord is on me, because he has anointed me to proclaim good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim freedom for the prisoners and recovery of sight for the blind, to set the oppressed free, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favour.' The wellbeing of everyone, but especially those in need, is at the heart of his ministry, then and now through those who choose to live for him.
