Speldhurst - Tonbridge School Transport Update

Another bus route is cut!

This time it is the Hams Travel No.1 which serves Groombridge-Langton-Rusthall-Tunbridge Wells and Tonbridge. The service is being withdrawn as at the end of September which will put further pressure on remaining services, unless another company steps forward to pick up the route.

As yet we have not been able to find a community solution for school transport, there are various car sharing arrangements in place. New families continue to move to Speldhurst who need these services so we will continue to lobby for reinstatement of buses with the help of Cllr. Matthew Sankey but as busses are a de-regulated service and KCC have no obligation to provide transport it looks as if it will be up to parents to make their own arrangements for the foreseeable future. NATURE WATCH

We see both Fallow and Roe deer around the village. The Fallow are usually seen in small groups but can be found in the fields with herds over 30+. Roe on the other hand are usually in pairs or on their own. In October it is when Fallow deer are in the rutting season which is spectacular on estates like Knole Park and well worth a visit. Roe deer are about the size of a large dog the Bucks [males] have short antlers with 2 or 3 points. Fallow deer are much larger and the antlers are broad with a number of points. As you mostly see deer running away they can be told apart by the back ends. Roe have one which looks like a white powder puff tail whereas the Fallow has a flat white tail with a black strip down the middle.

In October the ivy comes into its own. The last wild flowering plant of the year for a number of species including those that hibernate through the winter. The last butterflies that over winter as adults are found on ivy with a number of moths and a species of bee called the Ivy Bee whose emergence is timed to coincide with this abundance of food. There are also large numbers of wasps and hover-flies if you stand and watch a patch of ivy flowers in the sun.

I found a caterpillar of the Toadflax Brocade moth on the Purple Toadflax by the Chapel fence opposite the shop, a moth species that is on the up.





SPELDHURST CHAPEL PROJECT CONSULTATION UDATE

Parish councillors voted to proceed with an application for a Public Works Loan Board (PWLB) loan at a Full Council meeting on Monday 4th September. This was after receiving a strong mandate from our recent whole parish consultation, with a total of 623 households responding to the consultation, representing 32% of households across the parish.

The results for each of the 3 questions were as follows:

- **Q1.** Do you think Speldhurst Parish Council should be taking steps to protect local assets such as the Speldhurst Community Shop?
- 89% said YES
- Q2. Are you in favour of the parish council proceeding with this project?
- 85% said YES
- **Q3.** Are you in favour of the parish council proceeding with this project knowing it will include a council tax increase of £12.49/yr for a Band D property, for the purpose of loan repayments?
- 82% said YES.

A breakdown of answers to each question by village has been published on the parish council website and can be accessed at www.speldhurstparishcouncil.gov.uk on the 'Speldhurst Chapel Project' page.

While the parish council will now proceed with an application for a PWLB loan, there are several steps to be completed and specific conditions to be met before we will draw down the loan, subject to it being approved, to purchase the chapel site. If unforeseen problems arise or conditions are not met – in particular, if the community share offer fundraise by the Chapel Project team does not raise sufficient funds to meet their obligations – the parish council will not draw down the loan. The parish council only becomes liable for the loan when it is drawn down and not when it is approved.

RESULTS OF THE SPELDHURST CHAPEL PROJECT PARISH CONSULTATION

ELECTRIC VEHICLE CHARGERS - LANGTON GREEN VILLAGE HALL CAR PARK

By the time you read this (fingers crossed!) Kent County Council (KCC) will have installed two 7kw electric vehicle chargers in the car park at Langton Green Village Hall. This is part of a trial which they are funding on parish council owned land throughout Kent. KCC have paid for the installation and maintenance, and will take payment from users via a payment app.

The charging bays will be clearly signposted. We will monitor usage to see how much uptake there is. For more details, please contact the council office.



BACK UP TO FULL CAPACITY

With the co-option of Langton Green resident Caroline Davies, we are back up to our full capacity of 13 Parish Councillors once again. Caroline has worked in the Housing sector for over 15 years, both for private and public organisations. Her current role at a national

housing association includes managing Property Compliance and Building Safety matters for a large property portfolio. She is also a Board Member of a Housing Association that provides affordable housing for women escaping domestic abuse, survivors of trafficking and women leaving prison.

We feel most fortunate to be able to benefit from Caroline's experience, which is particularly relevant to some of our current projects.

GATWICK AIRPORT'S APPLICATION TO CONVERT ITS EMERGENCY RUNWAY

Gatwick Airport have applied to the Planning Inspectorate to convert their stand-by runway into a full-use runway. By applying in this way, they have avoided a full public consultation. If successful, two runways will operate simultaneously with plans to serve up to 74m passengers yearly.

We are now preparing to comment in opposition to this application via the Planning Inspectorate website. The deadline for comments is 29th October, so if you are concerned about another full-use runway at Gatwick, please visit https://infrastructure.planninginspectorate.gov.uk/projects/south-east/gatwick-airport-northern-runway/# to give your feedback.

Meanwhile the SEN accommodation 'the Cabin' which was being built over the summer holidays, is now complete. It is now furnished and in regular use for the screening and support of those with special educational needs (SEN) as well as for interventions for those who need a bit of extra help in particular subjects. It is also the base for Michelle Heap, who has just joined the staff as maternity cover for Special Educational Needs Co-ordinator (SENCO) Laura Stanyer-Fisher. Congratulations Laura and her family on the birth of her son, Milo Stanyer-Fisher, who arrived promptly on Tuesday 5 th September. Other new staff include Teaching Assistants (TAs) Lynnette Voisey in Pippin Class and Georgina Kelly providing 1-1 support, Nicole Pollen teaching those with dyslexia, and a new School secretary Amy Lucas.

As well as the equivalent of seven fulltime TAs in class and a SEN TA who provides the intervention programmes, Speldhurst has a Pastoral Care Lead, a Family Liaison Officer and a School Counsellor to cater to the needs of every

child.



And healthy eating is all part of a holistic educational approach. By half term this October, we also expect to have the new kitchen up and running thanks to the fantastic progress made by 'Chris Browne Builders 'over the holidays. The new kitchen will mean that meals for pupils and staff will be freshly cooked on site and our caterers 'Independent' are currently recruiting a chef and kitchen staff to start as soon as the work is completed.



And as a Governor I am looking forward to an invitation to sample the new menus once the kitchen is fully operational. In the meantime, I found a quote from Winnie the Pooh that 'food is fuel' although he did of course like a lot of 'hunny'!

Why Pumpkins Carved at Halloween?

Carving pumpkins is a Halloween tradition that originated hundreds of years ago in Ireland. Back then, however, the carvings were made out of turnips or potatoes. It wasn't until Irish immigrants arrived in America and discovered the pumpkin that a new Halloween ritual was born.

Halloween is originally based on the Celtic festival Samhain 'summer's end', a celebration in ancient Britain and Ireland that marked the end of summer and the beginning of the new year on November 1. In the 8th century, the Roman Catholic Church moved All Saints' Day, (a day celebrating the church's saints), to November 1. This meant that All Hallows' Eve (or Halloween) fell on October 31.

So that's how we got to the pumpkin's association with Halloween. But what about pumpkins? The word "pumpkin" originates from "peopon," which means "large melon" in Greek. It then evolved to "pompon" in French and "pumpion" in Britain. The Americans later changed it to "pumpkin," the name we still use today.

Pumpkins are a member of the gourd family, which includes cucumbers, honeydew melons, cantaloupe, watermelons and zucchini. Scientists believe that pumpkins originated in North America about 9,000 years ago. The oldest pumpkin seeds have been found in Mexico and date back to somewhere between 7,000-5,550 B.C.

Indigenous North Americans have grown pumpkins for thousands of years—even before the cultivation of beans and corn.

The most classic kind of pumpkin is the Connecticut Field pumpkin, named after the state where it was cultivated, and it is not far off from a kind of squash grown by Native Americans long before Europeans arrived in the Americas. With its uniform shape, the Connecticut Field pumpkin is ideal for pumpkin carving and decoration.

Pumpkin cultivation has spread throughout the whole world, and they are grown on every continent except Antarctica. In 2012, the biggest producers of squash were China and India, which put out a combined 10.5 million metric tons of the fruit. The United States is the only country in the top five where squash is native, and it puts out a measly 778,000 tons.

Here are some other things that may not be known about pumpkins.

- 1. Interestingly, pumpkins are 92 percent water. Naturally low in energy density, pumpkins are an excellent source of potassium, vitamin A and beta-carotene, the powerful antioxidant that gives orange vegetables and fruits their colour.
- 2. The heaviest pumpkin was grown in Belgium in 2016 and weighed a whopping 21,190kg almost the weight of a small car!. The heaviest pumpkin in the U.S. was grown in New Hampshire in 2018 and weighed 1,146kg. The largest pumpkin pie ever baked was in Ohio in 2010. It weighed 1,678kg and was over 20 feet in diameter.
- 3. Pumpkin seeds should be planted between the last week of May and the middle of June. They take between 90 and 120 days to grow and are picked in October when they are bright orange in colour. Their seeds can be saved to grow new pumpkins the next year.
- 4. The average pumpkin has 500 seeds. They are perfect for roasting with olive oil, and enjoying as a snack.

Due to the ever-growing demand for the winter squash, UK farmers are producing more and more each year. In fact, Britain is home to Europe's largest pumpkin grower, in Lincolnshire, producing a whopping 2 million pumpkins per year. But come the end of October, demand drops dramatically – so is it worth it for the farmer.

A Letter from St Mary's

October 2023

Dear Friends,

I hope you all had a good Summer holiday. We certainly did at St. Mary's. Instead of expecting people to come to join us in the church building, we took our main Sunday worship out



into the community and held services on the rec, the allotments, in the school and in various gardens throughout the village. There were one or two damp moments but generally the weather was fine and a good time was had by all. It was a reminder that the church was never meant to be an institution confined to a building on Sunday, but a movement of people involved in their local community and sharing the good news of Jesus throughout the week.

This is why that at the heart of St. Mary's we have a network of around a dozen HOME GROUPS. These are small groups of roughly eight to ten people who meet on a weekly basis to build lasting friendships and help one another grow in faith, especially through bible study. Groups meet for a couple of hours in the evening or during the day in people's homes around the village. By joining a Home Group people are welcomed into a close circle of friends where burdens can be shared and joys celebrated. In addition to bible study and prayer, groups meet socially and sometimes come together to organise a church or wider community event. Home Groups are of central importance: they enable the St. Mary's family to grow and reach more people but still support and stay in touch with the needs of everyone. Gathering the whole church together for Sunday worship is fantastic and inspiring but smaller groups allow us to connect with God and each other at a more personal and deeper level.

Using small groups to grow the church is not a new idea. Two thousand years ago, before he started his ministry, the first practical thing Jesus did was to call together a small band of twelve disciples. St Luke, in the Book of Acts, tells of an expanding network of home churches where believers "Devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and to fellowship - They broke bread in their homes and ate together with glad and sincere hearts".


