We look forward to seeing the enjoyment and development local children and visitors will get from the new slide and climbing apparatus. Do please bring them to use it.



NATURE WATCH



The Holly trees are loaded with bright red berries and another good tree for berries is the Rowan. These make for good eating for the winter thrushes such as Redwing, Fieldfare, Song and Mistle Thrush - the Blackbirds too who seem to be in very low numbers for this time of the year.

Last winter was supposed to have seen a large number of Waxwings which did not happen. This year they have arrived in large numbers. A flock of 500 hundred has been seen up north so keep an eye on all those trees full of berries, as they are a great bird to see.

Also, there has been a major movement of Coal Tits in Europe. They also might be coming our way. They have a more blue/grey mantle instead of the olive tones of British birds.

A single oak tree which is 400 years old produces 234,000 litres of oxygen a year while soaking up carbon dioxide and can support more than 2,000 species of birds, insects, lichen and fungi. In the Autumn, if you look at the leaves of an oak with all the areas eaten by insect larvae and the lichens on the bark that number looks possible.

If you feed the birds please keep the feeders clean and also the areas underneath the feeders. This will help to stop the spread of diseases which have a big impact on the Finch family.

Its the 9th of November, as I write and I have just found 25 large White Butterfly caterpillars on my sprouts with a Red Admiral feeding on the rotting crab apples. I spotted a pair of Common Darter damselflies egg laying a couple of days ago and there are lots of other insects still around.

I must admit the weather is a lot warmer than 10 years ago, is this the new normal only time will tell.

News from Cllr Matthew Sankey

The topic that I am asked most about right now is TWBCs purchase of the long lease hold of Royal Victoria Place.

Due to the commercial nature of this acquisition, I am bound by a NDA and TWBC entered an agreement to only respond to a defined set of FAQs. I will do my best here to outline what we have done and why based on those.

TWBC owns the Freehold of RVP, it always has done. It then issued a long lease to the original shopping centre operator. Since then, several firms have acquired this long lease and finally in October of this year TWBC were in position to complete on the purchase of the very same lease. This marriage of Freehold and Leasehold offers TWBC significant control over the site, something it simply has not had since the centres opening in 1992.

TWBC isn't going to be running the day-to-day operations, this role has been contracted out to a firm called Rivington Hark. I was on the panel interviewing them and I was blown away by their pitch. Their vision and track record in this area is 2nd to non – Our shopping centre is in good hands!

But why have we done this? Town Centres across the nation are suffering due to many factors. One of these is simply that the town itself doesn't have control, via TWBC we now have control of the largest site in the town. If we look at how bad not having control can be, just look at the cinema site, with this site out of our hands we could very well have had yet another white elephant blighting our town centre.

With RVP in our control, so is the future of our town centre.

Job one, offer Free parking, ok so it's just for Sundays in December but it's a start!

Community Support Fund

I'm delighted to report that The Borough Partnership, that's the "coalition" that's running the council, a partnership of the Alliance, Labour & the Lib Dems, have agreed to create another £100,000 fund to help those most in need via local charities.

Whilst council finances are not overflowing we feel it's more important than ever to ensure that our community works together to provide those most in need.

Last year this proved to be successful and again we invite charities and causes to apply to the panel for a chunk of the funds.

If you know of any worthy causes, please pop me an email and I'll ensure they get seen.

2024 is going to be interesting politically with an all-out local election with all new wards and a huge general election too. I'm sure we've all seen the bar charts and bizarre cartoons, it's only going to get more aggressive from the nationals as they fight hammer and tong for the Parliamentary Seat – Whilst Paul & I will remain focused on what matters to us, but most importantly, things we can actually have an effect on here in our ward.

All that leaves me to say is I hope you all have a Merry Christmas & a Happy New Year.

Speldhurst pupils have enjoyed taking an artistic approach to history this term. As part of their Tudor topic year 5 children in Crispin class have been studying fabrics and clothing of the era, culminating in the creation of stunning self-portraits as Tudor royalty. They had a wonderful time deciding upon textures, colours and embellishments and are rightfully very proud of the results. Here is a wonderful collage of their paintings.



Whilst in Bramley class year 3 children also had a busy term - this time with colour - learning how to mix watercolours to match the artwork with some famous paintings. They all did a fantastic job and the classroom is now a gallery of their attempts to reflect the colours of artists over nearly 300 hundred years - 1490 to 1770.

Meanwhile Victorian teaching came to school for a day. The pupils all dressed up to reflect society at the time - the way children were treated and women's struggle for votes. Russet Class (Year 6) enjoyed a day of Victorian learning thanks to a session run by Alan from 'The Victorian School'. The children dressed up in a variety of costumes, from chimney sweeps to suffragettes, and experienced Victorian school life by sitting in segregated rows and experiencing the harsh punishments of the time. It wasn't all dunce caps and raps on the knuckles however, as the children got to play some fun Victorian games in the hall in the

in the afternoon. This was a great opportunity for the children to gain a real insight into the Victorian period and they all really enjoyed seeing history come to life.

Outside school Year 6 enjoyed a week of swimming lessons at Holmewood House School. We made the most of the fact the private schools have longer holidays than us by using their facilities. The school sent minibuses for us each day and the children had a great time both in the pool and on the buses! NEWS FROM SPELDHURST PARISH COUNCIL

NEW ELECTRIC VEHICLE CHARGE POINTS

It has taken some time, but we now have two fully operational quick-charge electric vehicle (EV) charge points in the car park at Langton Green Recreation Ground. We will get an update every quarter on the EV charger usage to see how they are utilized. This is a small first step towards ensuring that residents without the facilities for a home charge point can still charge their electric/Plug-In Hybrid Vehicles (PHEVs) nearby.



Everyone, especially Village Hall users, staff working at the parish council office, Little Birches Nursery, and Pavilion Café, together with school parents, café customers, and sports club users will be able to use the charge-points, which will also show up on Zapmap, a widely used app showing drivers the nearest charge point location.

Some notes on using the EV charge points:

- To pay for charging, you will need to download the Connected Kerb payment app, details of which can be found at the charge point.
- There is a 24-hour helpline listed on the charge point, which you can call if you experience any issues when charging.
- The charging bays are marked specifically for use by electric/PHEVs only. We will have a monitoring period through to March 2024 assessing how these spaces are used. We appreciate that there will be teething troubles, and we will always answer any comments or questions people have about the usage of these spaces. For example, the car park is heavily used during school drop-off/pick-up times, and we appreciate that parents might need to pull into a charging bay for a couple of minutes while they drop their children off.

 As with disabled parking spaces, if a councillor notices an EV charging bay is being used for longer periods of time by any vehicle that isn't charging, we will give a 'gentle' reminder of their intended use.

PARISH COUNCILLOR VACANCY

Ben Scarbrough resigned from the parish council in October. A Langton Green resident, Ben was co-opted in June 2019. He was a calm presence and a valued member of the council, and his considered responses were particularly appreciated during his time as vice-chair of the Finance committee. Thank you, Ben, for your hard work and contributions.

Ben's resignation means there is now a councillor vacancy to fill, so if you read this before 1st December you still have time to apply. Becoming a councillor is a unique experience. You'll be part of the democratic decision-making that affects local life from the environment to highways, planning, and more. Alongside attending meetings and voting on parish matters, you can also get hands-on with work like helping maintain local footpaths. Allotment &Gardening News ~



Helping Wildlife in the Winter

In the last Newsletter, there was mention of putting out food during the winter to help wildlife. By putting out food, gardeners can make a significant contribution to supporting wildlife. It is also a great way to watch wildlife even in the smallest of gardens or balconies, often at very close quarters.

Here are a number of tasks recommended by the Royal Horticultural Society that will help turn gardens into a wildlife haven, increasing the diversity of creatures that can not only survive but thrive.

Garden birds, in particular, benefit from feeding year-round, but winter is a time to provide foodstuffs with a high fat content to help keep them warm. Feed regularly so that birds will not waste vital energy visiting your garden when there is no food.

- Help birds in winter by placing fat blocks in wire cages. Balls in plastic nets are not recommended as birds such as woodpeckers can get their tongues caught.
- Create your own fat blocks by melting suet into moulds such as coconut shells or logs with holes drilled in.
- Alternate different recipes to entice a range of birds; peanut cakes for starlings, insect cakes for tits and berry cakes for finches.
- Put out finely chopped bacon rind and grated cheese for small birds such as wrens.
- Although fat is important, also provide a grain mix or nuts to maintain a balanced diet.
- Sparrows, finches and nuthatches will enjoy prising the seeds out of sunflower heads.
- No-mess mixes are more expensive but the inclusion of de-husked sunflower hearts means there is less waste. Inferior mixes are often padded out with lentils.
- Use wire mesh feeders for peanuts and seed feeders for other seed. Specially designed feeders are needed for the tiny niger seed, loved by goldfinches.
- Feed placed on a wire mesh held just off the ground will entice ground-feeding birds such as robins and dunnocks.
- Thrushes and blackbirds favour fruit. Scatter over-ripe apples, raisins and songbird mixes on the ground for them
- Consider planting berried and fruiting trees (if you can) such as malus, cotoneaster and pyracantha to fill gaps.

Looking after other creatures:

Check bonfires before they are lit for sheltering and hibernating animals, such as hedgehogs, toads and frogs.

Melt a hole in the ice on ponds to allow the wildlife to drink, and enter and exit the water. Fill a sauce pan with hot water and sit it on the ice until a hole has been melted.

- Do not hit or crack ice as this can send shockwaves through the water that harms wildlife.
- Be careful when you turn compost heaps. As these are often warm, they can be the winter resort of frogs, toads and other animals.
- Provide a shallow dish or container of water at ground level. This will benefit other garden wildlife that needs to drink, as well as birds.
- Make an insect or bug hotel and put up in a sheltered position. Overwintering ladybirds and lacewings will find this useful.
- In late winter, clean out bird boxes so they are ready for new nests in spring.
- Leave healthy herbaceous and hollow-stemmed plants unpruned until early spring. These can provide homes for overwintering insects.

A Letter from St Mary's



December 2023

Dear Friends,

Did you know this year is the eight hundredth anniversary of the Christmas crib? Francis of Assisi, concerned about the secularisation of Christmas in his day, started the tradition in 1223.

He'd been to visit the Holy Land and like many before him, and since, was moved when he came to the spot traditionally thought to be the birthplace of Jesus.

Wanting to restore the central message of Christmas to his community he decided to create a living crib in the village of Greccio in the Rieti Valley in Umbria, contacting a local nobleman who provided an ox and a donkey together with a stable so that his plans could bear fruit; a tradition that continues to this day.

We all have our traditions at Christmas, don't we? No doubt this month we'll be discussing when to put up the tree and maybe how many! We'll be negotiating which decorations we will use and when to open the presents. But it's easy for the central message of Christmas to be lost in all our preparations. Jesus is the reason for the season.

The good news that God sent his Son as a vulnerable baby to live amongst us and to die for us is the good news of Christmas. By creating a living crib all those centuries ago St Francis reminded his fellow Umbrian's of this. Why not do the same this year, yourselves? You may already have a crib which you bring out each year.

If not, why not create one or buy one and start a new tradition in 2023? And why not come and celebrate Christmas in one of the churches in the parish too? There are carol and crib services, midnight services and Christmas Day celebrations. You'd be most welcome. More detailed information about all these services appears elsewhere in the magazine.

But most of all, may you have a blessed and peaceful Christmas however you celebrate.


