
















Happy New Year!

NATURE WATCH



December has been very and wet and windy and now the beginning of January looks dry and colder. This should slow down the plants of many types from flowering too early and missing the pollinators they need to set seed and fruits. The question I keep getting asked is where are all the smaller garden birds this winter. I do not have the answer but it seems to be everywhere in this part of the county this includes the water birds on the reservoir. The met office has just announced 2023 was the hottest year so far, so not many birds migrating from Europe. As soon as the British Trust for Ornithology have the data we will hear. The Waxwings have arrived in Tonbridge and the industrial estate in Tunbridge Wells and might be seen wherever berries are still on trees up until the end of February.

We all know about hibernation where the 3 species of mammals - Bats, Hedgehogs and Dormice - build up their fat reserves by eating as much food as they can before winter sets in. They then find a safe dry place and fall into a deep sleep where almost all of the bodily functions slow down until just ticking over to help the animal survive the cold days of winter when there is nothing to eat.

Have you heard about Brumation? It is a period of dormancy exhibited by reptiles and amphibians in colder months. It is very similar to hibernation in that it is characterised by extended periods of very minimal active periods to save energy.

Reptiles are ectothermic, which means their body temperature is dependent on their environment. As it gets colder reptiles will become more lethargic and less able to hunt, therefore entering Brumation is the best way for them to get through the winter.

Eat your heart out Jamie Oliver – Speldhurst School has a new kitchen – worthy of any restaurant – and the lunchtime menus are already proving very popular. Parents and visitors were invited to enjoy a taster day. Years ago when my youngest daughter was still at the school, I made a BBC Radio 4 Food programme with presenter Sheila Dillion about the lamentable state of school dinners after many schools – particularly smaller ones - were forced to use outside caterers with the closure of their on-site kitchens. The celebrity chef then took up the baton with his TV programme in 2005 and Tony Blair's Government committed £280 million to improve meal provision.

In recent years Speldhurst has had brilliant outside caterers but there is nothing like a school meal prepared and cooked on site to tempt more children, who previously didn't have school dinners, to enjoy them. Already there are lots more pupils enjoying the freshly cooked food, tempted by delicious aromas wafting through the school – and fabulously colourful and appetising looking salads.





Building the kitchen so we can cook on site has been a long outstanding ambition and it is wonderful to see it in action. Thank you to everyone who helped raise funds to allow this project to succeed.

Encouraging a healthy lifestyle is important to everyone at Speldhurst and there is great enthusiasm for sport. Recent triumphs include our team being crowned winners of the Basketball tournament at Leigh Academy – for the first time ever. Congratulations and thanks to Mr Vale Taylor and Luke Carpenter who prepared the team for the event.

Meanwhile the girls football team has gone from strength to strength having won three games in a row- the latest an 8-1 victory over St Marks last week. They're developing into a fantastic team.



Whilst at the Cross Country event at Skinners Playing field, Speldhurst celebrated a lot of great performances, a few top 10 positions and Leo in Year 5 won the Year 5/6 boys race by some distance (see him giving the thumbs up below) He also won the Year 3 and 4 boys race last year. We have high hopes

for him as a runner for the future!



Meanwhile, back in school, Yr 4 in Empire Class brought something of Ancient Egypt to the school. They recreated the mummification process by mummifying carrots! NEWS FROM SPELDHURST PARISH COUNCIL

To all our residents in Speldhurst, we wish you a very Happy Not-so-New Year – here's to a healthy and productive 2024.

THE PRECEPT - THE PORTION OF YOUR COUNCIL TAX PAID TO US

Every year, all parish councils look at their finances and determine what the precept will be for the coming year. This process starts in October and the final decision is made in January.

This year, due to inflation, rising prices, and the energy crisis, we have been faced with our costs increasing much more than we had budgeted for. We estimate our costs have risen about 12-13%, but we don't wish to raise our precept that much.

For that reason, we're looking to set the precept at £195,000, which works out to a 7.4% rise for each household in our parish. This means we're anticipating having to spend some of our reserves next year. We're aware that this can't continue in the longer term, but we feel that setting the rise lower than our cost increases is the right thing to do, considering the cost-of-living increases that are affecting us all so sharply. Further, thankfully, the tax base (the number of people who pay council tax in our area) has increased a little since last year, meaning the rise is a bit lower.

We should mention that the average amount your parish council receives from the overall Council Tax is just 3%. The breakdown of each £ of Council Tax collected and where it goes is:

Kent Police 11p Parish Councils 3p Kent Fire and Rescue Service 4p Tunbridge Wells Borough Council 9p Kent County Council 73p We've also kept our precept low, historically, in comparison to other parish councils both locally and in the Kent area. When figures are this small, the percent increase can look high, but our pounds and pence figure is still relatively low compared to the other organisations in your council tax bill.

In addition to the 7.4% precept increase that will be used to cover day-to-day expenditures, there will be a new expense added to your council tax bill this year. This is to cover the annual repayment costs for the Public Works loan that the council is applying for to purchase Speldhurst Chapel. You can read more about this loan and the terms of its repayment at www.speldhurstparishcouncil.gov.uk under the 'Speldhurst Chapel Project' tab.

As several of you have requested, we will ask that the amount required from each household to repay the public works loan appears as a separate item on your council tax bill. However, If the tax authority does not approve our request to have this amount listed separately, the precept increase will appear much higher - around 25%. It is worth bearing in mind that the amount required to repay the loan will decrease over time as we continue to pay it back. If, after reading this, you are still unclear about anything we have written, do get in touch – contact details below.

It is always at the forefront of councillors' minds that the money the council spends belongs to the community, and getting the best value for ratepayers is very important to us. Our financial records are available for examination, and we continue to work hard to ensure proper value is delivered from the small slice of tax that we receive.

REPORTING INCIDENTS TO KENT POLICE

The Parish Councils Co-Ordinator at Tunbridge Wells Police Community Safety Unit has asked us to share the following message:

"Over the past month, we have been meeting with parish and borough councillors across the whole of the Tunbridge Wells district. This is a new initiative to further engage with the councils embedded within their communities, to help raise any concerns with our staff and officers in our Community Safety Unit.

One particular concern we are seeing raised is a perceived lack of reporting to Kent Police regarding incidents happening in some of these areas. We have used these meetings to highlight the importance of reporting all incidents to the police, no matter how big or small and our officers pride themselves on gathering information that can really help build a picture of an issue or ongoing complaint.

There is also sometimes a perception from these meetings that 'nothing will be done', and I want to offer assurances that this is most certainly not the case. For example, over the past year, there has been an increased focus on tackling anti-social behaviour in and around Tunbridge Wells, which has included enhanced patrols aimed at deterring and reducing offences and which include shop thefts, assaults, and criminal damage.

Our enforcement action has seen charge rates rise for several offences linked to antisocial behaviour. Between October 2022 and September 2023, there were 49 charges made for criminal damage, compared to 27 in the previous corresponding period - a rise of more than 80 per cent. Charges relating to offences involving the use of violence have also increased, to 230 from 204; whilst at the same time, the number of reported incidents involving the use of violence in the borough has fallen.

It is important to again highlight that information we receive regarding incidents within our communities, is often crucial to resolving residents' concerns, deterring and solving crime, and improving people's lives. Your support or information can help provide the missing puzzle piece which helps your local officers solve a crime."

To report a crime, call 101, this ensures you receive a crime number. You can also sign up to www.mycommunityvoicekent.co.uk, a crime prevention messaging service provided by Kent Police.

What Brussels Sprouts This Christmas Led Me To 'Dig Up'

I was contemplating my Christmas lunch (just before tucking in), feeling reasonably satisfied that on the plate were brussels and potatoes grown by me. I'd also harvested leeks, cabbage and broccoli. But those were for another time.

Although I was happy about my harvest, what was interesting was that just before Christmas, supermarkets were selling vegetables for just 19p. For that price, you could buy a swede or a bag of carrots or parsnips. Or all, totalling a good amount of vegetables for just 57p.

That surely can't be profitable for the supermarkets. And impossible to compete with from an allotment or garden veg plot (taking into account the time spent).

Kilo for kilo, there is no contest when it comes to financial outlay and value between allotment or garden produce versus supermarkets. At 19p per item, the supermarkets win 'hands down.' But there are other considerations – some of which have been touched on before. But what also came to mind were these comparative thoughts:

When we buy fruit and vegetables from a supermarket, they are almost always in pristine condition i.e. mostly regular, good-sized and washed. When I harvest produce from the allotment it almost always is dirty, nibbled and often containing added protein (such as slugs, caterpillars, worms – which love to find their way into cabbage).

What I have often contemplated is how do the farmers achieve the 'quality' of produce for the supermarkets. Cost considerations aside, if my produce is affected by the attention of 'wildflife', how come the supermarket produce is not?

Surely farmed produce is 'controlled'. This can mean the application of chemical conditioners. So as in many other circumstances, I turned to Google. The results were interesting. Here are just 3 examples indicating what (according to a Defra survey) is sprayed on commercially grown non-organic crops.

Brussels Sprouts; Broccoli (Sprouting); Cabbage; Calabrese; Cauliflowers; Kale, etc: On average are sprayed with - 3 insecticides, 2 fungicides, 2 molluscicides and 2 herbicides. Other pesticide applications were found to include physical control agents and sulphur.

Tomatoes: On average are sprayed with - 28 biological control agents, 4 fungicides, 3 physical control agents, 3 insecticides and 3 sulphur sprays during the growing season. Other pesticides used included disinfectants, acaricides, growth regulators, soil sterilants, herbicides and tar oils/acids.

Strawberries: On average are sprayed with - 14 biological control agents, 13 fungicides, 5 insecticides and 2 acaricides during the growing season. Other pesticides used included disinfectants, physical control agents and sulphur.

With such a range of treatments, there is added concern about the possible effects of a cocktail effect of chemicals in and on our foods. It's not my intention to go into that here – though finding out about this is not difficult – just enter 'the cocktail effect' in an internet search engine and there is plenty of information there.

Amongst the many benefits of growing produce, one of the key principles is that what we eat from our allotment is totally organic, utterly fresh, free of any anything-icide with virtually zero food miles and just about as healthy as it is possible to be (even with a little added protein chucked in).

How fortunate are we in our community to have our allotments – our village resource - where we can achieve the objective of eating healthy produce. Anyone now interested in an allotment? If so, see below who to contact. It can change lives.
