Chapel Project Update

Thank you again to everyone whose pledges meant a successful fundraising in December. The Chapel Project Team are now progressing on the key elements required to move ahead with the project, namely

- finalizing plans and drawings for the extension and refurbishment of the Chapel
- · applying for planning permission
- inviting tenders for the building contract
- · establishing the charity to receive donations
- · agreeing terms of a lease with Speldhurst Parish Council

Once all of these matters are either finalised or very well progressed, we will ask those who have been kind enough to pledge financial support to pay their pledged amounts to the charity (donation) and / or the community benefit society (community shares). Initially we had estimated that to occur in Q1 2024, but realistically that will not be until Q2 2024 given the several workstreams that need to be completed.

The other essential part of the Chapel Project is the purchase by Speldhurst Parish Council of the Chapel and site. It's very positive news that SPC have been successful in their application for a Public Works Loan Board loan, a key step in SPC's purchase of the Chapel. Before committing to buying the Chapel, SPC will also need to be satisfied that the matters listed above are finalised.

We will keep our pledgors, members and the village updated via email, Facebook and Speldhurst News. Thank you again for your support to date.

Come and join us for a delightful evening of music played at the court of Louis XIV, the Sun King, in 17th century France. Ensemble Molière will play music by, among others, Charpentier, Lully and Couperin, some of the leading French Baroque composers, with the pieces dedicated to every moment of the King's day. Hear the music which provided the background to the great King's daily life!

Ensemble Molière has five female musicians who all play historical instruments and has gained a reputation as an established early music ensemble. It was selected as the first-ever Radio 3 New Generation Baroque Ensemble for two years from October 2021, a new scheme run in partnership by BBC Radio 3, the National Centre for Early Music and the Royal College of Music.

Ensemble Molière has given concerts throughout the UK and Europe. They were finalists at the York Early Music International Young Artists Competition and Future Baroque Artist at the London Festival of Baroque Music. They have also been involved with some interesting cross-arts projects including one to celebrate the 400th anniversary of Molière's birth. This saw the Ensemble joining forces with two clowns to create a new music theatre show which is an exploration of Molière's world through his words and the music of his time.

PLANS FOR POCKET PARK

After working hard on our application for funding, we were thrilled to hear that Sussex Lund - part of https://highweald.org/ - had approved a grant for a schedule of works to enhance biodiversity in Pocket Park, Roopers.

SGN ROAD WORKS

As you will know, SGN is currently undertaking works to replace gas pipes along the A264 to Langton Green. We understand that temporary traffic lights are expected to continue along this stretch of road until May 2024.

We have noticed that SGN has been efficient at updating this website during the recent works, and it is worth visiting and creating an account so that you can receive updates.

PLANNING APPLICATIONS - STAY UP TO DATE

It seems that many residents are still unaware that Tunbridge Wells Borough Council (TWBC) no longer write to notify you when a neighbour submits a planning application. Instead, they post planning application notices on telegraph posts, fences, or gates outside or near the relevant property. However, these fliers are not always posted in the most visible places, and they can come loose and fall off.

So, the most reliable way to stay up to date with planning applications where you live is by signing up for planning notifications on the TWBC website: https://tunbridgewells.gov.uk/planning/applications/notifications

Garden Friends and Foes

I was reading a very interesting small book picked up at a National Trust secondhand bookshop about garden 'friends' and 'foes'. According to the author, because gardens are sheltered and contain a wealth of plants, they provide a haven for wildlife too. Apparently, private garden spaces in Britain cover about 1,801,151 acres. Twice the size of Kent. Bigger than the Lake District, Snowdonia and Yorkshire Dales combined. A lot of space by any reckoning. Consequently, the potential of gardens as a haven for wildlife is considerable. Many provide food, shelter and breeding sites for a wide range of animals which increases the interest and enjoyment of a garden.

But, back to 'friends' or 'foes'. Early in the list are ants. Apparently, for the few ants that we see 'marching' in columns around our gardens in search of food (these are the 'worker' ants), thousands more are below ground in a network of tunnels. Ants are commonly to be found under patio slabs, in flower pots, creating small piles of earth along the edge of the lawn or even attempting to tunnel their way into our kitchen! The common black garden ant is one of the most robust and prolific to be found. Colonies can grow to around 15,000 workers, but the average is between 5,000 to 7,000. Apparently, ants are friends because they kill insect grubs and caterpillars to feed their larvae. They also help to mix and aerate the soil - but I'm 'feeling' that this is stretching the 'friend' case somewhat. They're foes because their tunnels can undermine or even kill shallow-rooted plants. Red ants sting. They like to feed on ripe fruit, often herding and protecting aphids, milking them for sugary honeydew - often seen on vegetables like braid beans which can become infested in the spring (GAH!). As the queen lays eggs and the colony grows over the early summer months, worker ants will forage further afield to find new food sources. This will often bring them inside properties - which is when they can be a real nuisance.

Dear Friends,

HOPE



NATURE WATCH



I have sent off my Butterfly and moth records for last year. I found 23 species of Butterflies and 275 species of Moth, bringing my garden total for all years to 399 different moths give or take a couple. Looking forward to finding some new ones this year. Here are a few interesting facts about moths.

A number of the small moths look like bird poo. Other moths mimic Hornets, Wasps, bumblebees, dead leaves, and Birch twigs all to keep safe from predators.

Some moths enjoy a bit of cannibalism. Like most moth caterpillers the Dum-bar feeds on salad, however given the opportunity they will eat other moth caterpillers including their own kind. Moths also play a key role in pollinating plants and flowers by night. In fact recent research shows that they are better at it than Bees are during the day. A few moths like the China-mark and the Water Veneer have their caterpillars feed on water plants and pupate just beneath the surface of the water, or in the case of the Water Veneer up to Im below the surface. Some Tiger moths are capable of producing ultrasonic pulses which we think help to confuse bats and let them escape being eaten.

The Peppered moth's usual form is pale with black speckles. It also has a genetic mutation which has black wings and this form domnated in the industrial cities where pollution killed off all the lichens on the tree bark so the black wing peppered moth blended in on the sooty tree trunks while the pale one stood out



and was eaten by the birds. As a result of successive generations the black moths outnumbered the pale forms in towns. While in the country the pale forms remain dominant.

Moths can be found all the year round, while Butterflies only fly in the day light, Moths can be found both in daylight and in greater numbers at night.

VEGETABLE OF THE MONTH: BEETROOT

Beetroot is an incredibly versatile, beautiful and nutritious vegetable. It can come as the traditional purple but also yellow, striped and white. It has many recognised health benefits as it is full of antioxidants like betalains that fight cell damage and inflammation.

As a food, beetroot is extremely versatile; it can be eaten raw; it can be cooked and it can be pickled; it can, also, be eaten in both sweet and savoury dishes.

Here is one of my favourites: from the Riverford Companion Book:

Beetroot, potato and horseradish rostis

Ingredients

2 large potatoes, 1 large beetroot, 1 small red onion, 1 tsp grated horseradish from a jar, 1 large garlic clove,, roughly chopped bunches of dill, tarragon and parsley, 1 tbsp. plain flour, sunflower oil for frying, salt and pepper for seasoning.

Method

Put the potatoes in a pan of cold salted water and slowly bring to the boil, then reduce the heat and simmer for 5 minutes. Turn off the heat and leave the potatoes in the hot water for 15 minutes so they are half cooked. Drain and peel.

Coarsely grate the potatoes, beetroot and onion into a large boil. Finely grate the horseradish into the same bowl. Crush the garlic and add to the bowl with the herbs. Season with salt and pepper, sprinkle the flour and mix well.

Heat the oven to 190 *C/G* as 5. Shape the mix into burger style shapes. Add the oil to a no-stick frying pan and fry the rostis until golden brown on both sides. Transfer to a baking tray and cook in the oven for 15 minutes.

You can serve instead of potatoes, or add a range of ingredients such as: smoked salmon and crème fraiche; grilled portobello mushrooms; watercress, blue cheese and a drizzle of honey; or, spinach and poached eggs.
