

Allotment & Gardening News



One Year of Seeding - Seven Years of Weeding

A wise and rueful gardener's saying on the 'dangers' of allowing weeds to grow and seed themselves. It is also a very old saying with references going back to the 1860's.

Anyway, what it also indicates is that in the gardens and on our allotments, we don't stand a chance. I read the other day, an awe-inspiring but rather depressing statistic, that a hectare of land can contain as many as 555 million weed seeds in it's top 15cm – that's as many as 55,500 weed seeds in each m2 in our gardens. And they are being replenished every year.

But all is not lost. There are things we can do. Annual weeds can be kept in check by hoeing, hand-weeding and mulching – which is my particular favourite approach on the allotment. The grass clippings of just about every lawn cut goes to the allotments for mulching.

Perennial weeds however present more of a challenge and I am not sure there are many solutions other than to laboriously dig them up one root at a time.

In survey after survey weeding is rated as the most disliked activity in the garden. It's a season-long requirement which many of us tackle badly with little done to prevent an infestation around growing plants where weeding must be performed most carefully. And generally, we tend to wait until the weeds are truly an eyesore.

The general care and cultivation of plants requires the full attention of the gardener, with both eyes constantly open for unwanted pests and diseases and both hands employed in the tasks of feeding, weeding, training and pruning.

But...no matter how clever we are, there is no way of completely protecting our plots and gardens from weeds. We just have to live with them. And if we are clever or prepared to widen our diets, there are a number of beneficial and nutritious uses for weeds – they are not necessarily the outlaws of the plant world. But more on that another time.



Speldhurst CEP School News



When I paid a Governor's visit to School this term, I found there was a much more popular visitor that morning - a beautiful black labrador called Gus and his owner Speldhurst resident Min Flemmington. The two of them volunteer through the Pets4 Therapy charity where Gus was assessed for his suitability after Min sadly lost a much older pet which had been a therapy dog. "I just put Gus's name down with the charity – never imagining that he would be suitable – he's still a young dog".

There's no doubt he is one of the most chilled, intelligent and empathetic dogs I've ever met and even slightly apprehensive children enjoyed stroking and cuddling him. Indeed his visits have such a positive impact on the children, that the School is hoping to open up the visits to pupils as part of a reward scheme.

All the years I have been involved with Speldhurst (both my daughters attended), it's been a happy school with the wellbeing of the pupils at its heart and links with other schools, both primary and secondary. This term year 4 pupils from Empire class spent an exciting afternoon at Tunbridge Wells Grammar School for Girls (TWGGS) as part of a music event. Together with multiple other primary schools, they played lots of different songs on the recorder creating a beautiful symphony.

TWGGS has always had a reputation for its music. Certainly, there's little doubt that the encouragement and opportunities the school gave my daughter Charlotte Andrew started her on the road to a professional music career. From her first tentative performance playing Danny Boy on violin at Speldhurst school's end of term concert to Jazz singing at TWGGS, performing with local bands and playing in classical concerts, she has always loved music. It's not an easy life, lots of hard work, commitment and disappointments but one which has opened up the world for her. Some of you in the village may know her by her stage name Charley Blue after her success on the Voice and more recently she appeared on TV again as Taylor Swift in Starstruck.

She's now taking her singing/violin playing act as a guest performer on cruise ships. Over the past year ,she's set foot on all seven continents during her travels – and this Christmas and New Year was in Antarctica for two months - performing six nights a week but spending the days with penguins, whales and seals! She's about to fly out again to join a cruise ship on its way to Sri Lanka and I'm going to join her – how lucky am I?

EASTER BISCUITS

Ingredients


225g plain flour
100g butter or block margarine
100g caster sugar
1 egg (beaten)
1 teaspoon vanilla extract
Apricot preserve
Icing sugar, food colouring and decorations



Method

- Beat the butter and the sugar together until light and creamy
- Gradually add the egg and the vanilla
- Now continue adding the flour until a dough is formed
- ◆ Chill
- Rolland cut into desired shapes
- Bake for 10-15 mins at 180 deg C.
- Melt the apricot preserve
- Mix icing sugar into a dough and rollout and make shapes
- Cool the biscuits then paint on the conserve and stick on shapes and add decorations
- ◆ Eat and enjoy!

Dear Friends,

The POWER of Forgiveness

Forgiving someone who has hurt you is notoriously difficult. It's much easier to seek revenge and to say things like, "I'll get you back for that". Other phrases spring to mind such as "don't get angry, get even." Or we try to take the moral high ground and put off forgiving someone by insisting they say sorry first before you will get around to forgiving them.

The trouble is this approach only does you more harm.... Lots more harm...

It can make us angry, although we tend to squash it down inside so that it's not always on show.

It can make us bitter and the more there are that we haven't forgiven the worse that gets.

It takes up headspace as we hang on to the issue(s) and we start to live more in the past than we do in the present.

With all that anger and bitterness inside it can make us ill, physically or mentally.

Forgiveness is deciding in your heart to let go of the past; it is wanting to be free of that person who caused all the pain, heartache and grief; it is being prepared to forgive them again and again until the pain subsides.

It does not mean approving of what someone else did.

It does not mean pretending that evil never took place.

It does not mean making excuses for other people's bad behaviour.

It does not mean justifying evil so that sin somehow becomes less sinful.

It does not mean overlooking abuse.

It does not mean denying that others tried to hurt you repeatedly.

It does not mean letting others walk all over you.

It does not mean refusing to press charges when a crime has been committed.

It does not mean forgetting the wrong that was done.

It does not mean pretending that you were never hurt.

It does not mean that you must restore the relationship to what it was before.

It does not mean that you must tell the person that you have forgiven them.

It does not mean that all negative consequences of sin are cancelled.

If you totally forgive them and release them you will be set free. It will make such a powerful difference in your life.

I wonder if you had this bible reading at your wedding, 'Love is...'

1 Corinthians 13:4-7

Love is patient, love is kind. It does not envy, it does not boast, it is not proud. It does not dishonour others, it is not self-seeking, it is not easily angered, it keeps no record of wrongs. Love does not delight in evil but rejoices with the truth. It always protects, always trusts, always hopes, always perseveres.

I'm always happy to talk about this with anyone who has questions but for now I pray that God will bless you as you forgive.

NATURE WATCH



As I write this in early March we are in the middle of our yearly Toad Patrol at Bough Beech and all over Kent, run by the Kent reptile and Amphibian group [KRAG]. So far we have helped across the road 101 Toads mostly males, the females arrive later. 105 Smooth Newts and 10 Great Crested Newts, as yet we have not seen any Frogs on the road. Unfortunately 2 of the G.C.Newts had badly damaged tails. All our 3 species of Newts belong to the salamander family and are capable of re-growing lost limbs within a few weeks, including toes and tails allowing them to survive being attacked from birds, mammals and certain fish when they are in the water. The reason we rescue them from the road is they are often run over by cars etc. We find the largest numbers of Toads etc. on very wet nights with a temperature of 10+ degrees C. Great fun!

The Blackthorn is always the first native tree to bloom in the spring, unfortunately with all the heavy rain it has not shown its best this year ,I hope enough pollinators have managed to fertilize the flowers otherwise we will be short of sloes for the sloe gin.



Now is the time of year to plant new flowering plants, perennials now and annuals at the beginning of May, look for flowers that are good for our insects of all types Bees, Butterfly and Moths.

I have just heard of a Robins nest with young in the village, it must have started nest building in the beginning of February.

PLANNING APPLICATION FOR A 3G PITCH AT LANGTON GREEN

We have been busy this month hearing residents' views about the application Langton Green Football Club (LGCSA) has made for a 3G pitch to be installed adjacent to Langton Green Rec. As we write, the application is still open for comments from the public; to read it and comment, visit the Tunbridge Wells Borough Council (TWBC) website: https://twbcpa.midkent.gov.uk/online-applications/

using the reference number 24/00235/FULL to search for the application.

Please note that although we have commented, the parish council is not the decision maker for this application – TWBC's Planning committee will decide at an upcoming meeting (date to be confirmed) and will be pleased to receive residents' views on the proposal until the meeting is held.

HOW TO STAY UP TO DATE WITH PLANNING APPLICATIONS



You may have seen our message about planning applications in last month's magazine, however, after feedback from residents who were unaware of the recent 3G pitch application for some time, we feel it's worth repeating.

TWBC no longer notifies you if a neighbour applies for planning permission. Here are two things you can do instead to stay informed

about new applications near you:

- Look out for planning site notices posted on nearby trees, posts, and fences (be aware, these fliers aren't always posted in the most visible places and can also come loose and fall off).
- TWBC posts all planning applications on their website, and you can sign up for notifications about the applications closest to your address here: https://tunbridgewells.gov.uk/planning/applications/notifications

Do you have a neighbour who is housebound or not a regular internet user? Do tell them if you think an application could affect them. We encourage everyone to engage with parish planning applications - whether to oppose or support, you should know how to have your say.

There is usually planning information in TWBC's Local magazine too; hopefully, you've had the Spring edition through your door. And, of course, you can always contact us with your questions.

RECYCLING – WHY SHOULD YOU DO IT AND WHAT DOES IT MEAN IN SPELDHURST PARISH?

Plenty of statistics support a continued effort to recycle:

"Recycling stops tonnes of waste being buried in landfill. In the
UK, recycling saves about 10-15 million tonnes of carbon emissions a
year, the equivalent of taking 3.5 million cars off the road".

In short, it is definitely worth recycling as the impact of not doing it is
probably creating a bigger environmental impact than you think. There is
always more we can do!

There is a plan that one-day bins will all mean the same thing for every council across the UK, but until then many of us may need a reminder of what each of our bins can and can't take. Incorrect recycling can result in spoiled loads and an increase in what ends up in landfill.

We have had a few bin changes over the past years, and what goes in each bin can be a mystery from one council to the next. SO if you are new to the area or need a refresh on what goes in your array of bins read on!

GREEN BOXES - PAPER/CARD RECYCLING

IN THE BOX....

- Newspapers, supplements, magazines, catalogues, leaflets, flyers
- Cardboard, egg boxes, cereal boxes and corrugated cardboard etc, paper, envelopes, greeting card
- Gift wrap (non-metallic/glitter) tape removed from boxes and wrapping NOT IN THE BOX....
- Glass, plastics, and cans these go in your brown bin now
- Padded envelopes
 Tetra food and drink cartons there is no facility for recycling tetra locally at the moment
- Card etc with food products or grease pizza boxes cannot be recycled
- Metallic gift wrap

WHY SHOULD YOU BOTHER?

One of the most significant benefits of recycling cardboard is that it reduces the volume of waste sent to landfill. By recycling more cardboard, less ends up in landfill which thus lessens the damaging effects.



TALL BROWN BIN

IN THE BIN

Glass bottles/Jars - any colour

- Aerosols empty
- Clear or coloured plastic bottles
- Food tins & drinks cans
- Plastic pots/tubs
- Plastic food trays & punnets (NOT BLACK)
- Aluminium foil & Foil food travs
- All these items should be rinsed

NOT IN THE BIN

- Black plastic/flowerpots
- Cling film or film lids from food packaging including crisp and biscuit packets and bread bags, cat and dog food pouches
- Plastic egg boxes
- Tetra Pak cartons there is no facility for recycling tetra locally at the moment
- Other kinds of glass (Pyrex, drinking glasses, window glass)
- Gas canisters or cylinders

NO PLASTIC BAGS

ALL ITEMS SHOULD BE RINSED AND PLACED LOOSE IN THE BIN – DO NOT USE PLASTIC BAGS. Local supermarkets have plastic bag recycling; they do not get recycled in our bins. If we recycle with our plastics in a plastic bag, then this can spoil the load which is ultimately a waste of time for everyone with everything ending up in landfill.

WHY SHOULD YOU BOTHER?

Recycling helps to reduce energy usage and means we are less reliant on raw materials; it takes 75% less energy to make a plastic bottle using recycled plastic compared to newly made plastic. Metal is endlessly recyclable, and a tin can be recycled and back in shops in as few as 60 days!



FOOD CADDY/FOOD RECYCLING BIN

IN THE BIN

- All cooked or raw leftover food no packaging
- Including Dairy products (Cheese), eggshells, tea bags, coffee grounds, meat, fish and bones, fruit and vegetables, leftovers including pet food, bread, cakes, pastries, rice, pasta, beans
- When lining your kitchen caddy, use newspaper, paper bags or compostable bags (look out for the SEEDLING logo)
- If using compostable bags, please do not tie the top as it takes longer to compost

NOT IN THE BIN

Plastic bags!

WHY SHOULD YOU BOTHER?

Any of these, when left in with general waste, can cause one of the biggest issues for our environment. When wasted food goes to a landfill, the nutrients in the food never return to the soil. The wasted food rots and creates pockets of methane, a powerful pollutant greenhouse gas. We are all conscious that methane is a by-product of agriculture, but landfill is also one of the main sources of methane in the UK – and this is largely down to food rotting in pockets instead of being recycled.
