HOW TO GET IN TOUCH WITH YOUR LOCAL POLICE OFFICER

The recently appointed neighbourhood Police Officer for our parish is PC Lisa Whitehead. The best way to contact Lisa with any non-urgent issues you would like to speak about is through the My Community Voice messaging service, which helps residents, businesses, and community groups keep in touch with their local policing teams.

Any message you send will go directly to Lisa, and she will follow up. This messaging facility is useful if you have noticed issues such as an increase in anti-social behaviour and want to stay in touch with Lisa about what you have seen. Please be patient if you do not receive an immediate reply, Lisa's shift patterns do not always allow for a same-day response. Sign up for My Community Voice at:

Please do not use My Community Voice in an emergency - you should always dial 999 if you need an urgent response.

Lisa also advises that if you want to report a non-urgent crime that you think still needs police attendance, you should call 101. Alternatively, you can visit the Kent Police website:

If you don't have access to the internet, and no one to help you with this, you are welcome to contact the parish council for assistance (our contact details are on the next page).

₲ TIME FOR A TRIM? ₲

Does the hedge at the front of your house border the pavement? If the answer is yes, this is a gentle reminder to schedule a hedge trim if you haven't already, so your neighbours can safely use the pavement. This is particularly important on narrow paths, where overgrown hedges can force people with pushchairs or mobility aids into the road.

POCKET PARK NEWS



Thanks to funding from Tunbridge Wells Borough Council and Sussex Lund (part of High Weald Organisation) we now have a noticeboard at Pocket Park, which we have updated with lots of information about our biodiversity project, and the wildflowers and wildlife you can spot in the park. There are also tips from our local expert, Alan Ford, about

encouraging biodiversity in your own garden.

One flower not yet featured on our noticeboard is the Yellow Rattle. This has just popped up in the rewilded area and, according to the Wildlife Trust, is good at helping turn grassland back into meadow. It also provides food for rare moth algae. We have tried to make our noticeboard accessible to adults and children alike and would love you all to visit the park during the summer months, read about what we

Reception pupils were joined by the cutest of new class members last term – some lovely fluffy chicks. Every year Pippin class hatch eggs in an incubator as part of their exploration of their 'Ready, Steady, Grow' topic. Ten eggs were in-



cubated and after three weeks, the children were able to watch the first chicks hatch over a 48-hour period.

It is living education which I am sure the children will never forget and they enjoyed helping care for the chicks. But this isn't the end of the story. The school is now looking for forever homes for any more chicks that hatch including silky crosses which live up their name with their beautiful silky feathers, and mini chickens which are like normal hens but much smaller. If you don't have much space these may be

perfect for you. Please

contact the School if you are interested. Surrounded by beautiful countryside as we are, the natural world is a never-ending source of hands-on education and this term, inspired creativity and art. Year 3 children in Bramley class focused on flora, spending time making careful observations of a number of pieces of work from Katie Scott's Botanicum postcard collection. Using sketching techniques developed in class, each pupil created their own wallpaper design in the style of this contemporary botanical artist and illustrator.



Meanwhile some other talented pupils were selected to show-case a more physical creativity. Speldhurst parent and dance teacher, Holly McGrogan took some amazing young dancers to compete in a dance festival at the Stag theatre, Sevenoaks. They were the youngest there but some of the best, with big smiles on their faces at all times whilst their good behaviour backstage was a credit to the school and to their parents.

Parents play such a key role in our School community and a big thank you to the fabulous PTA who raise so much money, often for important resources such as new i-pads as well as towards capital projects like the new kitchen building.

A recent event was a Family Fun day which gave a perfect opportunity for school families to get together, picnicking and relaxing in the Schools beautiful grounds with plentiful food & drink on offer. There was a fantastic array of activities to keep the children amused from arts and crafts (photo below is the calm before the creative storm), face painting and fun inflatables. A special mention to Becky Willis and her team who organised, yet again – a fantastically fun and successful fundraising event.

The School is also fortunate in having so many links to the past in the area and as



part of their topic 'Magnificent Monarchs' Year 2 pupils in Galaxy Gala class visited Penshurst Place. They learnt about the history of the House, focusing on its links with King Henry VIII, King Edward VI and Queen Elizabeth I. The children studied royal Tudor portraits and then went on a walk and mini-hunt in the woods in search of present-day microinhabitants. Very different from Henry VIII

who used Penshurst Place as a hunting lodge in pursuit of deer and wild boar! Finally another appeal. Is there anyone interested in helping with the school crossing? This is a very important role, keeping children safe to and from school. Nature Watch

At Knepp farm in West Sussex this year they have had 14 pairs of White Storks nesting. This will mean we shall see a lot more of them flying around in the years to come. It can take up to 4 years before they are old enough to breed. There are also a few at Wadhurst Park which is part of the same reintroduction scheme. The Painted lady Butterflies have arrived into our area (see picture below). They migrate to the UK every year as they cannot survive our cold wet winters. The species originates from North Africa and it is said that the urge to migrate North is triggered by overcrowding at the starting point where the caterpillars eat all the food plants so they decide to follow the sun as it moves North over Europe to arrive on our shores. It is the only Butterfly to be recorded in Iceland and when the summer is over their offspring go back across the channel to Europe. It is a species where the eggs, caterpillars, pupa and adults can be found at the same timeslot in the summer. Its food plants over here are Thistles, Burdocks, Mallow and Common Nettle. They give them plenty to eat and build up their strength for the return trip. July is a good month for finding Butterflies. Go to Nature reserves on the North and South Downs for the Fritillaries Blues and Marbled Whites which should be in good numbers on a sunny day. Alan Ford

Hi Everyone,



Here's a thought...

We have more time-saving devices and technologies than have ever before existed. With ever more to come. Emails are faster than letters. Cars getting faster by the year. Washing machines, microwaves (or air fryers), dishwashers, ready meals, etc.

You get the idea. And yet, for a lot of our modern lives we are rushed off our feet. So many things we would do - if only we had the time.

In contrast, there's something about having an allotment or gardening that is the opposite of our modern lives. And that's what makes growing things so fulfilling. There aren't many time-saving devices (rotavators maybe - but not if you're 'no dig').

You can't hurry plant growth. There are no corners to cut. No technologies that make a cabbage grow faster. Or a strawberry taste sweeter. Or a lettuce crisper... etc.

Our plots and gardens are a different way of spending our time. A break in the mad rush. A place of tranquillity. In the case of the allotments, a place to meet. To socialise. Debate. Have fun in interpersonal exchange. Contrary to the clock. To the hustle and bustle. An antidote to much of our every day, week, month, year.

Nature experiences offer a solution to the feeling of time scarcity caused by contemporary lifestyles from the unique nature of human time perception, which is subjective and moulded by the experiences and environments in which we immerse ourselves.

It's not that we have a shortage of time. It's more that we have and inflict on ourselves an overload of everything else including deadlines, rush hour, traffic jams, appointments, etc.

By contrast, time on the allotment or spent in the garden is a replacement for that everything else with corresponding benefits in outdoor experience, patience, care, reduced stresses (unless you have a slug attack), enhanced health and well-being. I know where I'll be early in July...on the allotments enjoying the summer social BBQ with my fellow allotmenteers or anyone else who would like to join in. Care to join us?




