Borough Council update by Cllr Jayne Sharratt

In the summer I was lucky enough to sit down for a coffee with the editors of Speldhurst News in the George and Dragon. I say summer, but I walked there through a torrential downpour and spent much of my time dripping onto the stone floors and hoping that my coat might dry a little before I ventured out again. In many ways this feels like the story of the season – brief hopeful bursts of sunshine punctuated by an abundance of rain. It was fantastic to chat to Maria and Judith about the dedicated work they put into the magazine and the village, and they very kindly asked if I would write something to introduce myself to the

community.

You probably know that Speldhurst is now part of a bigger Borough Council ward, along with Langton Green, Ashurst, part of Groombridge, and Rusthall. Three Councillors have been elected to represent this area and I am one of them, alongside Cllr Matthew Sankey, and Cllr Alex Britcher-Allan. Alex and I are very appreciative of the fact that you have been excellently represented by Matthew for a number of years, and that he knows Speldhurst like the back of his hand. We work collaboratively with Matthew and together we will always put service to the community first.

A little bit about me – I live in Rusthall with my two children who go to school locally. I'm the Editor of Rusthall Life and Langton Life magazines, and I'm passionate about supporting families in the community – I campaigned against the closure of the Children's Centre in Rusthall and helped set up a parent and toddler group. Since May, it has been a real delight to meet some of you at Praise and Play in the church, the Village Fete, Parish Council meetings, and out and about. I've still much to learn about the village, but what has been most abundantly clear from the beginning is that you have a strong community, and you look after each other – the Community Shop and Post Office project is just one example of you getting together to do this.

Speldhurst Chapel Project – Update



Hello dear reader, I'd like to introduce myself as I will be keeping you updated in the Speldhurst News over the coming months on the progress of the Community Shop and Post Office and its move to a permanent home at the Speldhurst Chapel site. With the support of Speldhurst Parish Council and the village, the move will be the beginning of a new chapter in the shop's history.

So where are we with the Chapel project?

Funding – thanks to some additional generous support in recent weeks we are now at £388,975, just a whisker short of our £400,000 target. We are still accepting subscriptions to the Community Share Offer – please contact us at speldhurstchapelproject@gmail.com if you would like to help in this way.

Purchase of the Chapel by Speldhurst Parish Council (SPC) – drafts of the lease between SPC and the shop Community Benefit Society are being reviewed with the aim to finalise as soon as possible. Once agreed, the purchase of the Chapel by SPC should be able to proceed.

Building works - We have received indicative quotes from 3 building firms and are aiming to finalise the selection of a builder in the next month or SO.

Planning Permission – an application has been submitted, although we have been advised that it requires the submission of a Biodiversity Net Gain report before it shows as live on the TWBC planning portal. We are working on obtaining and submitting that report as soon as possible.

All being well, the purchase of the Chapel will complete in the next couple of months and work start on the Chapel in the first guarter of 2025.

A very big thank you to all of you who've already supported the fundraising and to the Parish Council who remain supportive to purchase of the Chapel using a Public Works Loan Board loan. It's wonderful to be able to keep such an important amenity which is much more than just a shop and Post Office. It is a social hub. Like many others, I never step inside without catching up with someone I know.

My relationship with the shop goes back to the Great storm of 1987 when as a young couple newly arrived in Speldhurst, my husband John and I had no power or communication for nearly 10 days after the hurricane. The Carters who ran the shop and Post Office at the time were very kind, giving us a small stove.

It meant that we could boil a kettle for a drink or hot water bottle and heat up a basic meal, a comfort in a house in darkness.

Later when my mother-in-law Helen moved from Stockport to the housing association flats in Ferbies, she visited the shop almost every day as it was difficult for her to get to a supermarket. Even then there was a limited bus service. In more recent years when my husband developed early onset dementia, he maintained some of his independence by walking up Barden Road daily to collect his newspaper and buy a chocolate bar or other goodie. Always he was treated with understanding, kindness and friendship.

After school my two girls would spend their pocket money on the brightly coloured loose sweets whilst on many occasions shop provisions saved me when I was short of milk, sugar or baking ingredients or I had nothing for supper. There are others who don't have transport to get to a supermarket, who rely on the shop. It's range of provisions is impressive and competitively priced — not to mention the best bread I have ever tasted and if you fancy a treat, wonderful cakes courtesy of Speldhurst's very own bakers, Baketastic. The downside for my purse is that I often go in for one or two items and come out with a bag full. Since the lovely Anu retired five years ago and the community took over, the shop has been staffed by our wonderful volunteers and paid managers. The shop and Post Office couldn't operate without them. There's no doubt it is the beating heart of our community. TONBRIDGE MUSIC CLUB FIRST CONCERT OF THE NEW SEASON

The Fitzroy Quartet, Saturday 5 October, 7.30pm Parish Church of St Peter & St Paul, Tonbridge.



As Autumn approaches, so does the start of Tonbridge Music Club's 2024/25 Season. As always, there is a wide variety of top quality music to choose from in our programme which starts in October this year and ends the following June.

Tonbridge Music Club (TMC) was founded as a charity in 1962 with the aim of bringing the highest quality music making to Tonbridge, thereby enriching the town's musical life.

Our musical events range from evening performances and coffee concerts by some of the most recognised musicians on the scene today, to school-based workshops and family concerts. By doing so, we hope to broaden the appeal of live music-making for all ages and stimulate the rewards that live musicmaking can bring. Our first concert of the Season demonstrates our commitment to these principles. The Fitzroy Quartet, one of the brightest and best young quartets on the current musical scene, bring insight, depth and energy to their music-making. The programme includes familiar favourites and more contemporary works, the highlight being the wonderful Debussy Quartet. Described as "engaging and responsive to the emotional worlds of each piece in turn", the Fitzroy Quartet was formed in 2015 whilst all four members were studying at the Royal Academy of Music, receiving tuition from the Endellion Quartet's Garfield Jackson. In the years since their formation, they have won many prizes and awards. Most recently, they are Tunnel Trust Award Winners for the 2019/20 season as well as being chosen for the Cremona Quartet's Le Dimore del Quartetto scheme. Other prizes include, 1st Prize in the Cavatina Intercollegiate Competition, 1st Prize in the Wolfe Wolfinsohn Competition, as well as the Sir John Barbirolli Memorial Prize and the St Peters Eaton Square award.

Water Content in Fruit and Vegetables

I was watching a Charles Dowding video, He was planting cucumbers, as well talking about how to grow them. However, he said something really interesting – don't over water cucumbers because they don't like it. Hang on, how can that be? Cucumbers must be almost totally water, so how come they don't like it. You'd think they would want plenty. But they I wondered, which fruit or vegetables have the highest water content. Well, what is interesting is that it's not fruit (per se). The fresh foods with the highest water content are: Lettuce, up to 96%; Celery, up to 95%; Cucumber, up to 95%; Bok choy, up to 95%; Radishes, up to 95%; Zucchini, up to 95%; Watercress, up to 95%; Tomatoes, up to 95%. Cucumbers are beaten by lettuce – which is no surprise and also, perhaps, the reason why lettuce tastes of virtually nothing ie there is virtually only water in it. But all the same, up to 95% water is a lot. And its just as well that plants are so much water because when and how to water, and how much – especially in such wet conditions that we seem to have had this year, can be a challenging matter. And Charles Dowding has something to say on that matter too. Here is what he offers:

Plants are amazing for the way in which they tolerate a wide range of conditions. Their growth depends on light levels, temperature, and moisture availability. The last of these three is the easiest to manage. He continues to comment that if there is not enough water, plants can go into survival mode. However, for vegetables, this can also mean smaller harvests. He says that how much to water is our call, and he comments that it can be a fun skill to learn, to observe plants and aim to give the amount of water appropriate for each vegetable, the weather, and the harvests we want. That seems like sound advice. However, what I have never found easy is to figure out what my vegetables are telling me. How would I know if they have enough, too much or too little water? Or even is the harvest quality is down to water, soil fertility, soil condition, light, direction of planting, warmth, etc. So many variables. No wonder we often get it wrong and are absolutely delighted when the crop is good – a matter celebrated during the harvest festival. NATURE WATCH

Great news for lovers of Spiders. The Fen raft spider has had a very good year. It was on the verge of extinction in 2010 and restricted to 3 sites in Britain.

Now after this wet summer the numbers counted this year at 12 sites in Norfolk alone were 3,750 breeding females. These spiders are the size of a man's hand and semiaquatic, live in ditches and small areas of water, [relax none found in houses]. They



can run across the surface of the water to capture their prey.

The spider's diet includes damselflies, dragonfly larvae and pond skaters and some will even take small fish and tadpoles. They have been subjected to a lot of conservation efforts and also a lot of watery areas that have been created for birds and plants has all helped in their recovery.

Atlantic Puffins have also shown an increase this year. The bird also goes by the names sea parrot or clown of the sea. On the Farne islands in Northumberland which were hit by Bird flu a few years ago in which five hundred + died, there has not been a count since Covid in 2019. So the rangers were very glad to find on the count this year a 15% rise in numbers counted in 2019. They declared the population stable with no sign of Bird Flu. It is now hoped that the same will be found all around the colonies in coastal waters of the British isles.

We still have a few Dragon and damselflies on the wing in October such as Migrant Hawker, Common and Ruddy Darters and Willow Emerald. There are also Butterflies such as Comma, Peacock, Red Admiral and if we are lucky a Migrant Clouded Yellow.

They will be missed but not forgotten and like leavers before have donated their own legacy to the school. This time it was benches for the Forest School sessions. Below are photos of the benches, carved with their names. I've written about the importance of Forest School before but here's a recap.

The outdoor sessions which take place throughout the year, whatever the weather include working together to build shelters, discovering and appreciating nature, developing skills like whittling wood and even lighting a fire as our ancestors did. Forest School has been shown from independent research to promote well-being, offering opportunities for child-led exploration and discovery, developing practical skills and problem-solving abilities, resilience and confidence. All qualities we hope our year 6 leavers will take on to the next stage of their educational journey and the rest of their lives. Good luck to you all.

A Letter from St Mary's



With Autumn well under way those of you who are gardeners (which sadly isn't me) have been busy harvesting the results of your labours in your allotments and gardens. And the farmers in the fields around us have been working all the hours God gave them harvesting the barley, wheat, and maize as well as the apples, pears and plums from their orchards. It is indeed a busy time of the year on the land. And traditionally it is the time of the year when we pause and say thank you to God for all he provides for us. And not just what is grown locally. We can enjoy many different foods, these days, coming from all over the world like coffee, tea, and chocolate to name but a few so it's good to say thank you for these too.

Harvest festivals have taken many different forms over the years. Sometimes a harvest lunch is held when everyone gets together to share a meal and give thanks; recently the children of Speldhurst School have joined together with the congregation of St Mary's Church and jointly collected produce to give to Nourish, the Tunbridge Wells Food bank as well flowers to the older members of our community.

The parish council and the Trustees of Langton Green Community Sports Association (LGCSA) will respect the Planning Authority's decision on this application and have agreed to collaborate to manage the Pavilion and recreation ground in a way that maximizes benefit for everyone.
