# Letter from St Mary's



The writer of Ecclesiastes is well known for his wise words about time. He starts off by saying, "There is a time for everything, and a season for every activity under heaven."

As summer makes way for autumn, we can see all around us the autumn fruits being harvested and fields made ready for the winter and spring crops. In the hedgerows the abundance of berries produced this year are being eaten by hungry birds as they make a last-ditch effort to fatten up for the winter.

Here in the villages of Speldhurst, Ashurst and Groombridge, we are making ready for changing times within the parish too. It is two and half years since Douglas and Mary left for the west country; two and a half years that have seen our church wardens and lay and retired ministers holding the fort until a new vicar had been chosen. Two and half years of prayer, asking God to bring the person he wants to lead us, to the parish.

This month we will welcome Rob Hindmarch and his family to a new season in their lives as Rob begins his ministry here. Rob's service of installation will take place on Mon 10<sup>th</sup> November at 7.30 in St Mary's Church, when the Bishop of Rochester will confirm his appointment as our new Priest in Charge. Do come along and support him and the family.

But the writer of Ecclesiastes has many more wise things to say to us in this passage. Reminding us, among other things, that there is a time to tear and a time to mend, a time to be silent and time to speak, a time to love and a time to hate, a time for war and a time for peace.

How shall we discern what that time is? Nationally and internationally, there are no easy answers to the challenges being faced and many despair. But as Christians, our hope is in God's providence and plans for his world. We may not understand why such terrible things are happening, but we know that Christ came into the world to reconcile everyone to God and there will come a time when, as St John wrote in Revelation, "there will be a new heaven and a new earth". When God, "will wipe away every tear from their eyes. And there will be no more death or mourning or crying or pain, for the old order of things will have passed away."

Meanwhile as we pray for the many issues facing our nation and further afield, we are called to live in peace with one another, and to care for the sick and vulnerable. It is the time to care for each other in whatever way we can.

Autumn is here – and with it comes the smell of woodsmoke, crunching leaves underfoot, chilly evenings - and of course the School's annual Bonfire Night which attracts the support of the whole community as it gets bigger and better every year. I am sure you will have seen around the village the posters designed by the children promoting this major fund-raising event organised by the PTA. This year it is being held on Saturday November 1 st - hopefully you'll have already bought your tickets. Many thanks to the McAuley's for letting us use their field opposite the school again – and also thanks to the pupils who designed the wonderful promotional posters. Below are the three fantastic winning entries chosen by judges Headteacher Stephanie Hayward and Deputy Head, Simon Howe.



Also in the run up to the Bonfire event, Year 1 children in Jazz class spent a fun day building 'Guys' for the bonfire with the support of parent volunteers. Now I wonder who amongst you know whom this is:

If you are a fan of TV's Gladiators, you'll recognise him as Gladiator Steel. So, you can imagine the excitement when he paid a celebrity visit to our school. Also known as Zack George, 'Steel'; led workshops for the children about healthy eating, active lifestyles, and developing confidence. He then visited each classroom for photographs and to answer any of their questions - a positive and memorable addition to the school day.



In another positive 'Well-being' event last term, Speldhurst pupils dressed for 'Hello Yellow Day', a national initiative led by the charity YoungMinds to raise awareness around children and mental health. Many came to school sporting yellow items of clothing from T- shirts to socks, hair accessories to badges. The aim of the day was to show those struggling with their mental health that they are not alone and to help to create a positive, supportive environment in school. Speldhurst is already working hard to achieve this, including giving some of our oldest pupils the opportunity to train as mental health champions, to help reduce stigma and provide support to classmates by promoting well-being strategies.



Meanwhile in class last term, history was brought to life with a visit from 'Henry VIII' who took Year 5 pupils in Crispin class back to Tudor days. He told stories of jousting and fighting as well as the grim justice metered out to peasants who stepped out of line. Everyone dressed up in costumes of the time and there was singing, dancing and music. Tales of severed heads, ship's rats, and pox aside, pupils had a 'Tudor-tastic' day.

which they followed up with this wonderful collaborative piece of art below. I wonder what Henry VIII would have thought of this portrait.

More recent history was also 'lived' by children in Russet Class when the Year 6 pupils experienced a day as a Victorian . They learnt about school life when Queen Victoria was on the throne – strict rules and rows of desks, dunce caps and punishments for the naughty or less able whilst they found out how 'less fortunate' children did menial jobs such as climbing up chimneys to sweep them. There also was discussion about the importance of the suffragette movement and a chance to play traditional Victorian games during breaktime.

Younger children in Year 1 also had the chance to find out about by-gone games with a visit by Jazz class to the Amelia Scott Centre where they were shown a range of beautiful toys from the past. They were keen to ask questions and handled the old items with care, later being given the opportunity to play with modern versions of these traditional toys.

And finally I want to tell you about one of our School's annual traditions – the Harvest Festival where the whole school comes together in St Mary's Church to celebrate the bountiful gifts of this time of year . What is sung may have changed over the years but as always the children were in good voice with the likes of 'Harvest Samba' and 'Cauliflowers Fluffy'. Many thanks to everyone who gave gifts of food and donations to Nourish. In these times, the work of Nourish is invaluable to those who need that bit of extra help. Also a big thank you to Kelly Kyte and her band of helpers who organised for Year 6 to deliver floral posies to local residents – another example of the School's strong links with the village. # Garden & Allotment News

## A Stranger in the Garden: The Mysterious Thornapple



This summer an unexpected visitor appeared in my garden: a thornapple, also known as devil's apple or devil's trumpet. I had never seen one before, and it raised a curious question - how can a plant suddenly appear where it has never grown before?

Apparently, the answer may lie in the way plants spread themselves. Seeds can travel astonishing distances. They may be carried on the wind (e.g. dandelions can travel to 60 miles), dropped by birds (e.g. mallards can also transport seeds up to 60 miles), or even hitch a ride in soil moved with compost or on the sole of a boot. Some seeds can remain dormant in the soil for years -sometimes decades up to centuries – waiting for just the right conditions of warmth and moisture to germinate. In the case of thornapple, its large, spiny seed pods can scatter hundreds of seeds, which are remarkably resilient. All it takes is one seed finding the right spot, and up comes a plant that looks, to the uninitiated, as if it has sprung from nowhere.

So, what exactly is the thornapple?

Belonging to the genus *Datura*, it is a striking plant with trumpet-shaped white or purple flowers and prickly fruit capsules that resemble medieval maces. It is not native to the UK, being from warmer parts of the world. It is listed as rare and scattered – typically only reported in a few dozen locations annually in a given year – but is also noted to have spread widely, often popping up in disturbed ground, waste places, or gardens where it was never deliberately planted.

Seems like we should be honoured to have one growing in our garden. What makes it especially interesting – and a little notorious – is its chemistry. All parts of the plant contain powerful alkaloids, once used in folk medicine but highly toxic if ingested. Historically, thornapple was associated with witchcraft and hallucinogenic rituals. Today, it is valued mainly as a curiosity of nature: a plant that commands both admiration for its beauty and caution for its dangers.


For gardeners and walkers, the lesson is simple. Plants can travel in mysterious ways, and the unexpected arrival of a thornapple is a reminder of nature's ingenuity. While it is fascinating to observe, I am advised that it is best appreciated with care - and left for the bees and butterflies, rather than curious hands, to enjoy.

Tonbridge Music Club's 2025/26 Season got underway on Saturday, 4 October with a sparkling performance by the Kleio Quartet, BBC New Generation artists for 2024-26. Our next two events – both of which take place before Christmas, show how the Club tries to offer variety in its programme, hopefully attracting a wide range of music-lovers, whatever their tastes.

At 11am on the morning of Sunday, 2 November, one of our increasingly popular Coffee Concerts will take place in the Music Suite at ~~Somerhill~~. Our performers will be winners of TMC's Award Scheme, now in its fourth year. The Awards Scheme is for young musicians who either live in Tonbridge or attend school in the Tonbridge area and offers them grants which enables them to meet musical costs. 
