Scientific name: *Spinus spinus*!

Garden & Allotment News

When Is the Right Time to Sow Seeds?

As late winter turns into early spring, many gardeners begin to feel the familiar urge to start sowing seeds. Seed packets offer guidance, usually giving a recommended month or range of months, but these periods can feel surprisingly broad. After all, a month is a long time in a growing season, and it raises an obvious question: is it better to sow early to give plants a longer start, or to wait?

This January I sowed chilli peppers, tomatoes and leeks. These crops benefit from a long growing season, particularly chillies and tomatoes, which need warmth to thrive and fruit well. Starting them early, under cover and with a bit of warmth, can give them a head start before they move outside later in the spring.

However, there is another school of thought. Charles Dowding, well known for his no-dig approach, often reminds gardeners not to rush. Seeds sown too early can struggle with low light levels, producing weak, leggy plants that need careful nursing. In his experience, seeds sown a little “late” often catch up surprisingly quickly once light levels improve and temperatures rise.

So which approach is right? As with many things in gardening, the answer is: it depends. Early sowing can work well if you have the right conditions – good light, some warmth, and the space to pot on seedlings as they grow. Without these, early-sown plants may stall or suffer setbacks that wipe out any initial advantage.

On the other hand, waiting until March can simplify things. Light levels are improving, days are longer, and seedlings tend to grow more steadily and robustly. For many crops, particularly vegetables and flowers sown outdoors, this can lead to healthier plants that quickly catch up with earlier sowings.

For gardeners planning to sow seeds in March, the best approach may be a balanced one. Reserve early sowing for crops that genuinely need a long season and can be kept warm and bright. For everything else, patience often pays off. Gardening is not a race, and plants have an impressive ability to make up for lost time when conditions are right.

In the end, seed packets are guides rather than rules. Observing your own conditions, experimenting a little, and learning from each season will help you find the timing that works best in your garden.

Speldhurst Down Under!

Our family took a really special trip to New Zealand at the end of 2025.

As we drove south through North Island, I remembered an email to this magazine, about a retirement village that had been built in Australia or New Zealand by a descendant of one of our own village residents and which had therefore been named Speldhurst.

Google revealed that Ivy and her family left Speldhurst for New Zealand via Tasmania in the late 1800s. Her grandson Wayne Bishop paid tribute to this family history when he built and opened his own Speldhurst in the small town of Levin, NZ (current population 20,000) in 2016. His Speldhurst will celebrate the 10th anniversary of its opening by the then Prime Minister of New Zealand John Key on 10th March 2026.

Built on the site of a Boys Training Farm and an RAFNZ airbase, the social hub of Speldhurst, NZ is The George. Street names around their village include Barden Road, Eyehurst Lane and Southfields Road as well as a Tea Garden Lane and a Holmewood Ridge. Speldhurst CEP Primary School News for March 2026



'Rain, rain go away, come again another day'. This School term there's been very few glimpses of the sun – and the roof (almost 200 years old) covering the old part of the School building needs fixing if it is to continue keep out the weather.

Speldhurst is very fortunate in having a committed, hardworking and inspired PTA who this term launched a campaign to raise money to help pay for the restoration and repair of the roof. One of the first events was inspired by the pupils themselves – an Art Exhibition of their specially created artwork which included abstract flower collages, Aboriginal inspired prints and detailed portraits.

Led by Year 5 teacher Cal Moss whose own creativity is often on display in the school hall as backdrops for plays or murals to celebrate Christmas and Easter, Mrs Moss along with other staff and the PTA Art committee of Deviani Parekh-Jones and Sam Simpson-Pagani curated the exhibition which for two days after school was open to parents and visitors. The artwork was framed and ready for sale with all monies going to the roof fund. And I hope you'll agree we have some wonderful artists at Speldhurst School.



Meanwhile in the classroom the evidence of the pupil's talent is everywhere – even in history; where Year 5 in Crispin Class are learning about the Ancient Greeks. The children designed and constructed their own 3D pillars - Corinthian, Ionic, Doric and sometimes a mixture of different styles – to gain understanding of Grecian architecture 2,500 or more years ago.



This year the National Year of Reading 2026 was billed as the biggest campaign in a generation designed to help more people discover the joy of reading in their daily lives. The campaign message urged everyone to: “Go All In on their passions and interests ..and discover how reading can unlock the things they already love – be that music, football, baking, family-time, sci-fi, or ... anything.”

With all of this in mind, Speldhurst really ‘went for it’ – setting the children a reading challenge to complete during 2026. Pupils were each given a record card with 12 reading challenges -one for every month - to encourage and excite them to find that passion for reading in their spare time. Each challenge must be signed off by an adult who may in turn find time in their busy lives to read regularly. I’m a bit of a reading ‘evangelist’ at the moment as I have just joined a book club.

As long as I can remember Speldhurst pupils have taken part in the Tunbridge Wells Primary School Singing Festival which has been going for the last 30 years. This year the School’s involvement is bigger than ever with music teacher Mrs Partridge taking 52 children to rehearsals at St John’s Primary School where our pupils from Years 3/4/5/6 joined with those from other local schools to prepare for a performance night on March 3rd at the Assembly Halls. As well as an opportunity for children to join in a massed choral experience, each school choir is showcased with their own song - a chance to have their moment in the spotlight! Speldhurst will be singing ‘A Whole New World’ from the film Aladdin. If you haven’t already booked, tickets will hopefully still be available on the Assembly Hall website. Remember Speldhurst School is performing on March 3 (final performance of the two-day festival) Exciting!



Back in School, the very youngest of our pupils in Pippin reception class had their own excitement with a visit from a fireman Ed Harrap (school Dad) NOT fortunately to deal with a fire but to tell the pupils what it is like to work in the fire service. Thank you very much Mr Harrap for visiting and all you do to keep our communities safe.

Other classroom visitors who also caused a stir were a trio of beautiful owls with their handler from the Owl and Raptor centre based in Groombridge Place. The children were fascinated to see the birds up close and learn all about their unique abilities. Apparently, it is a myth that owls can turn their heads 360 degrees BUT they can rotate their necks up to 270 degrees in either direction, allowing them to look directly behind them-



And finally, do you remember that last month our Year 3 children in Bramley Class were experimenting with light to answer the question 'can we see without light'.

The answer is (as I am sure many of you know) that we do need light to see but through their experiments, the children discovered that although dull/matt objects were hard to see without light, shiny/sparkly objects did give off a glimmer of light even when there was limited light surrounding them.

And now for this month as Porky Pig, the Looney Tunes character is famous for saying "Th-th-th-that's all, folks!"

DAVSS works in partnership with local organisations and community groups to ensure specialist domestic abuse support is available to residents when it is needed.

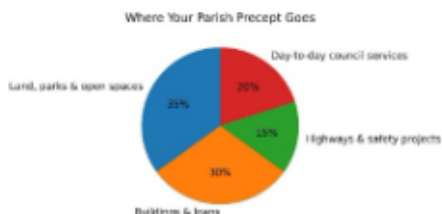
SPELDHURST PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

PRECEPT 2026/27



Every year we carefully consider our finances and determine what the parish precept will be for the coming year. This is the portion of Council Tax you pay to Tunbridge Wells Borough Council, which they collect on our behalf.

The precept for 2026/27 was agreed at our Full Council meeting on 5th January. The total precept of £258,912 represents an increase of £13,551 over the previous year or 4.8% for a band D property.



The Parish Council was very mindful of the cost-of-living challenges faced by households and families in setting the precept to ensure the best value for money for each of the services the Council is responsible for. Councillors

were also conscious that council reserves for unplanned or unexpected events are at the lower end of recommended levels. It was therefore important to strike the right balance to ensure known or anticipated costs for the next financial year were covered as much as possible from the precept rather than depleting reserves further.

The Council is fortunate to own several pockets of land, including the recreation ground, the children's play areas, and the car park at Langton Green. While the Council regards this as an important benefit, it does mean a significant portion of the precept is spent on maintaining these amenities. For instance, the Council has been replacing the wooden bollards at

The car park. This work is being spread over several years to keep costs, around £8,000 p.a., manageable. An important point to highlight is that the Council is continually looking for cost-effective opportunities to improve an amenity. An example is an investment in creating a wild flower meadow at

Pocket Park in Speldhurst to be funded by a combination of Council funds and external grants.

The Council also owns 3 buildings, the Parish Office, the old Speldhurst Chapel, and the Langton Pavilion. The loan on the Parish Office will be fully repaid in 2026/27. The loan on the old Speldhurst Chapel for 2026/27 represents a cost of £30,136. Speldhurst Community Shop and Post Office are responsible for all other costs associated with this building. For the pavilion, the Council is still budgeting to subsidise the building, albeit at a reduced level from 2025/26. The Council, working closely with Langton Green Community Sports Association, is undertaking a review of the pavilion, to be completed by autumn 2026, with a goal to put in place a viable financial arrangement that fully covers the operating costs of the pavilion going forward.

Finally, our Highways Committee continues to strive to improve highway safety throughout the Parish and is working on several initiatives. The costs involved are significant and higher than the Council's budgets allow. Notwithstanding this, the Council has set aside an additional £15,000 for 2026/27 to provide some seed funding. This is to demonstrate to the relevant authorities, such as Kent County Council, the Council's seriousness and commitment to unlock additional funding from them to allow these initiatives to move forward and hopefully be implemented.

While any increase in the precept is regrettable, Councillors have taken all appropriate steps to keep the overall increase as low as possible for 2026/27. If you would like to know more about the precept and how it is spent, our Clerk will be happy to answer your questions.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT REORGANISATION IN KENT AND MEDWAY

Government ministers have launched the statutory consultation on options for Local Government Reorganisation (LGR) in Kent and Medway. All five proposals that were submitted to Government by Kent and Medway councils are being consulted on, including KCC's option 1a for a single unitary supported by three Area Assemblies.

The consultation, which closes on 26th March, is public and open to anyone who wishes to respond. 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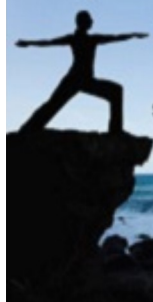
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
